SUPERSTITION

YESTERDAY was Friday, September 13th. By all the rules of superstition it is fairly bristled with possibilities of misfortune. Not only was it the 13th of the month, it was Friday—the 13th—a combination supposed to be freighted with a maximum of dire ill fortune.

PROTECTING GAME AND FORESTS

AT LEAST two of the Northwest states have taken action within the past few days to restrict big game hunting this fall. Two areas in Idaho have been closed, and Oregon has also taken action postponing the hunting season until later, probably until fall rains have started.

The ideals behind the orders are to protect the forests and to conserve game, and few real sportsmen will be found to criticize authorities for seeking these ends.

The losses by forest fires this year have been severe in the Northwest, and continued dry weather is causing the season of fires to be extended over a longer period than usual. Men who take to the woods for big game hunting are usually so well seasoned as woods men that they offer as little menace to the forests as any, but even careful men sometimes cause fires and to conserve forests is more important than to have big game hunting.

Wild game suffers when forests are burned and its usual habitats are reduced to black ruins, and wild animals in some districts are represented as surely needing protection and food. Good sportsmanship in such an emergency requires that the animals be given a recess against the skill of man-hunters and their shrewd weapons.

Best Editorial of the Day

NOT GUINITY

(Portland Oregonian)
 President Hoover's sensitive proposal that the riches of the mineral and unappropriated public lands of the far west be conveyed to the states has resulted in giving us insight into curious and unformed ideas that exist in other parts of the country as to administration of natural resources.

Here in the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, for example, commenting that:

Unfortunately the record of the west is hardly an argument in favor of relinquishing federal control to any great degree over any part of the public lands. The west had been pretty well exploited for the conservation and its conservation policy. It had withdrawn its prodigious natural wealth into an area of wastelands without regard to the race of private interests, and through them of the western states, who the 125,000,000 acres of forest reserves were withdrawn, almost entirely proved lost self-serving those frontiers were not unkind of the future. Mr. Hoover's letter is entirely consistent with the country's policy to a proposal to turn the forest reserves back to the states. He makes it plain that the forest reserves, the mineral reserves and the power sites should continue under control of the government and nothing else can be seriously thought of.

The foregoing may be only an indication of how serious the west is to be preserved to turn the forest reserves back to the states, and other ex-prosors and philosophers lead one to suspect that at least one institution in St. Louis there exists that is a champion of the west-west idea of control of forests and waterfalls.

The paragraph would seem to indicate to the west that it is not to be informed that, due to the indifference and corruption of state governments, long-haired ideologists and boosters and pitiful frontiersmen who exploited the forest and the mineral lands and the farming lands to such a degree that an indignant federal government overthrew state control, and took that responsibility upon itself. And now the superior morality of the public land and coal shall not permit the government to "turn back" these natural resources to the unprovoked and dishonest states.

If it be now said that these state lands were returned away it may also be said that their sale at what would now be an enormous price was made during a period of isolation and tax impoverishment and in competition with free government land. The truth is that the major portion of timber lands and other natural resources were accomplished under the laxity of federal laws and federal administration, and they should be taken by them representative of that of a geographical cross-section of the United States of America.

The position is not continued in St. Louis, that the history of dummy entries, bartering in soldiers' scrips, short-selling homesteading and all the other successful and unsuccessful devices of exploitation characteristic of state administration of natural resources needs to be met. Five some day they will be clanking up Teapot Dome against us.

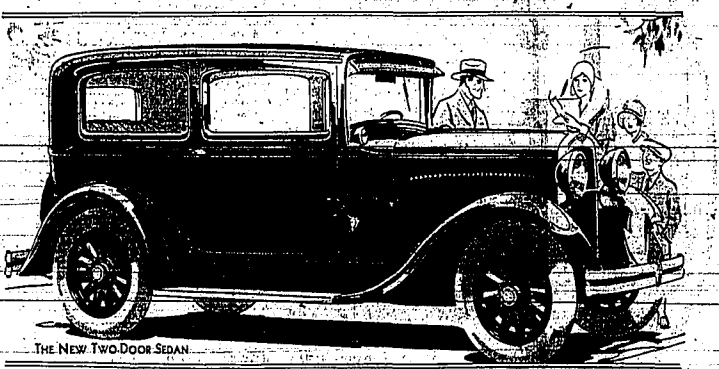

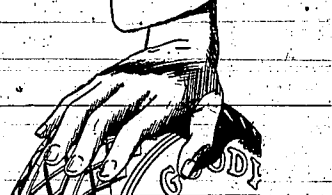

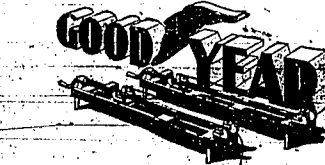
