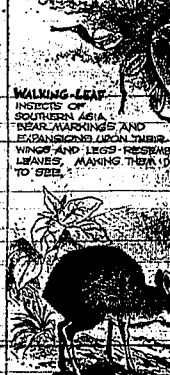

KNOW HOW TO APPLY FIRST-AID TREATMENT

Authority, Making Abstracted Bone Fractures, Declares That Everyone, in These Days of Uncertainty, Should Know How to Assist Injured

Life is full of uncertainties. A man starts out in the morning full of energy and ambition. He may come home on a shudder. Perhaps his accident is no more than a broken bone, but that

One bone makes up the framework of the body. To them are attached the muscles. Some of the bones serve to protect certain vital organs. The heart is well guarded by the surrounding walls of bone. So are the lungs—the occupy the same space as the heart. The brain is encased in a cast of bone. The joints are made of cartilage. They are capable of bending without breaking. As we grow older our bones become rigid and brittle.

Any break of the bone is called a "fracture." But not all fractures are the same. Some of them are "simple" and others are "compound." A "simple" fracture is a break in the bone which does not pierce the skin. A "compound" fracture is a break in the bone which does pierce the skin.

It is important to know how to apply first-aid treatment to a fracture. The first thing to do is to stop the bleeding. Then, if possible, to immobilize the injured part. This can be done by using a splint or a cast. The splint should be made of a material that is strong and light. It should be padded with soft material to prevent chafing.

It is also important to know how to apply first-aid treatment to a burn. The first thing to do is to stop the burning process. This can be done by removing the person from the source of the heat. Then, the burned area should be cooled with water. Do not use ointments or creams.

It is also important to know how to apply first-aid treatment to a head injury. The first thing to do is to stop the bleeding. Then, if possible, to immobilize the head. This can be done by using a collar or a neck brace. Do not move the person's head.

Before going farther, let me tell you how to use the preventive remedy for hand perspiration, which is as follows. One ounce of alcohol and one-half ounce of tincture of belladonna are mixed together and the mixture is applied to the hands with a soft brush. The hands are then washed with cold water and the gloves are put on.
