# Chicago Making World Series Plans

**GROVE-WALBERG MENACE WORRIES CUB SUPPORTERS**

National League Fans Wonder If Chicago's Right Wonders Can Swat Ripart-Postholders

CHICAGO, Sept. 19 (UP)—Chicago's first National league pennant since 1918, Chicago fans today feel their attention to the world's series.

The slogan "Come on Cubs, clutch that pennant" which has produced the best baseball attendance for 10 days was replaced by "Now let's get Connie Mack and his Attorneys."

Speculation concerning the series centered around the warring of Lefty Grove, Philadelphia's two great left-handers. Fans here think the outcome of the series will depend upon whether the Cubs can hit these men as they have despised the National league pennant.

Left handers have been hit freely by the right hand hitters on the Cubs, and in the past few months the Chicagoans have hit only two or three games to port-folgers.

However, there is a belief that there is no left-hander in the national league who can pitch as well as Grove or Walberg and there is an argument that the Cubs will find it just as hard to hit these men as American league batters have found it.

Meanwhile, the Cubs management "went ahead" with plans to utilize every available inch of space for seating the slightly more than 10,000 persons who will see each game here. Tickets have been made for 150,000 tickets and President William Vesce is allowing the tickets on the "draw" out of the hat basis. Each one lucky enough to have his application drawn is allowed to buy two tickets.

The Cubs themselves probably will take it easy in their remaining games. They do not have a championship to win but they will need seven victories to accomplish this. However, no one will be overlooked to achieve this. There is the matter of the home park championship. Both Mack Wilson and Hornsby probably would like a shot but each has a chance to win a championship if one must pay full amount to hit some runs.

CONSTITUTION DAY

"The most wonderful work ever struck off at a stroke, that by the brain and purpose of man."

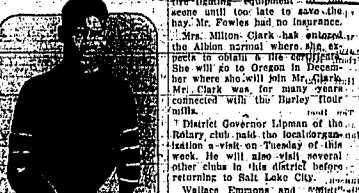

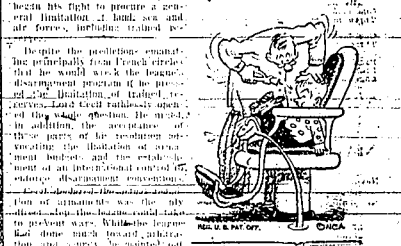

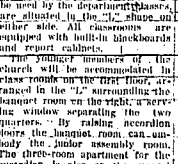
