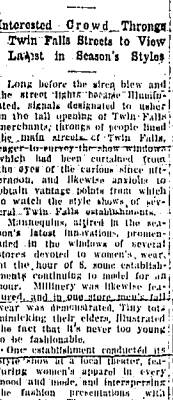

KEEPING UP

ONE of the characteristics of human nature is that in times of plenty we provide for ourselves necessities and luxuries which we have not felt able to buy in times of need. The combination of excellent crop yields and a high average of prices for crops has resulted in a spirit of optimism in this part of Idaho.

The spirit of optimism is in the air and influences conversation, thoughts and actions. This spirit is reflected in concrete form in buying, and expressed intentions to buy.

One of the chief difficulties faced by the automobile dealers is to secure delivery of machines to fill orders. Merchants have stocked their shelves in anticipation of a big volume of business. People in the Twin Falls county are in the mood at this time to provide for themselves, their homes and their families some of the wants that have existed for a number of years but which have seemed impossible to get during the protracted years.

This new spirit of our district coupled with the fact that our schools have recently reopened for another year's work and activities, is probably responsible for a renewal of interest in securing an adequate auditorium and gymnasium for our school system.

Private capital has been bolder in its launching of new building projects in the city during 1929 than for many years with the result that many new structures have been built, or are in course of construction. Such work is not only a credit to the citizens whose initiative and confidence are thereby given practical expression but also to the community.

The strongest argument in favor of the auditorium is that it is so badly needed. It can be secured without any increase in our present school tax. The construction would be another sign of confidence and faith in our own future, and it should give school activities such an impetus as nothing else could give. It would mean a sharing in very slight measure of the good things we enjoy with the youth of the community. Very few people can be found to deny the need of the additional facilities for our schools. We have withheld providing these facilities up until now because of caution in making expenditures.

Has not the time come when Twin Falls should have school auditorium and gymnasium facilities in keeping with our requirements and our position and responsibilities?

The subject is being discussed by an ever enlarging circle of persons in Twin Falls. We take pride in keeping up the facilities of our private business concerns. Can we really afford as a mere business proposition to delay long in bringing our school facilities up to the standard already established by our own neighboring communities?

BRINGING INDUSTRIES HERE

Idaho Falls, Sept. 20 (Special)—Impetus of the city for electrical energy totaling 25,000 horse-power indicate that Idaho Falls is getting considerable attention, both east and west, as a possible location for new industries. Seven companies, one of them requiring 25,000 horse-power, have asked if we can supply their power needs. We can—but not without explaining the present equipment.

While our facilities will permit us to care for the needs of the average factory or group of factories the prospect of one for 25,000 horse-power is a large order, and not so easily filled. That, however, should not keep us from making it bring that enterprising spirit of our business men here that seeks that amount of power is large enough to be a splendid plant for any city in the country. The power necessary to supply the demand of the large unnamed enterprises, that wants to come here, we can supply the power, could be furnished by development of the space and lower Mesa falls area, which the city already has filed.

We have unchanged possibilities in an electrical production line, which, if properly developed, will make this the industrial center of the Intermountain states. Industry wants to come where there is an abundance of cheap power. We have the power capacity to supply the demand of the Intermountain states. We will get our electricity at a rate low enough to induce factories to come here we can expect great industrial growth in the next few years. Idaho Falls should follow up the inquiries regarding our possibilities very closely. The capitalists who want a location for a plant large enough to use 25,000 horse-power of electricity should be contacted promptly and their proposition scrutinized carefully. If there is a possibility of setting their enterprises here we should go ahead with development of our electrical plants to a point where the demand can be met. Here is an opportunity that must not be overlooked. Every agency that is engaged in the development of Idaho Falls should unite in an effort to bring this and other enterprises here.

Idaho Falls should make it a goal to be the industrial center of the state, and electrical energy.

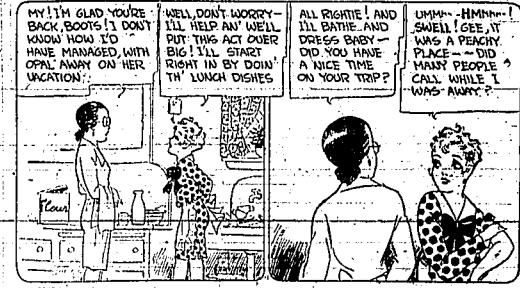
