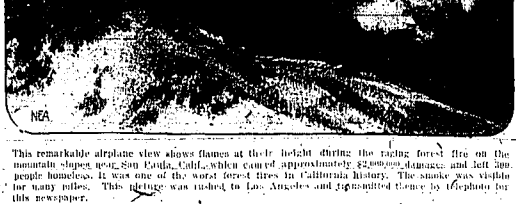

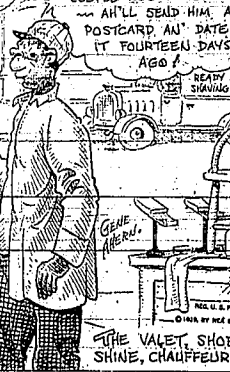

NO LOGIC IN THIS

OUR level-headed and business-like civilization does some strangely irrational things, now and then.

In New York's Sing Sing prison the other day a convict was taken ill with acute appendicitis. He was rushed to the prison hospital and an operation was performed. Unusual care was taken to see that his life was saved and that he had a speedy recovery. The state, it is only fair to say, took far more pains to prevent his death than would have been the case if he had been a law-abiding but penniless citizen on the outside.

And why? Well, the man was under sentence of death—and it was deemed extremely important that medical science keep him alive until the day when he should be strapped into the electric chair and killed in an orderly manner.

There is something supremely illogical about that episode. Perhaps you can figure out for yourself what is wrong.

"ANOTHER CONQUEST"

THIS newspaper devoted a little less than half a column the other day to announcement of the start made by Colonel Lindbergh on the initial flight of an air mail service to Central American countries. The faster service for the mails has been extended in such measure within so short a time that half a column was probably amply sufficient as news values are determined.

But the event is epochal, even though it was recorded in so small a space. The largest nation in the northern of the two American continents is to be in much closer contact with its neighboring nations in the southern continent. The air mail is the medium through which these nations bind themselves more closely together.

Preponderance of the world's wealth, racial ties and the march of empire have been a few factors that have bound the countries of the north temperate zone together and made the trails of commerce eastward and westward. From Asia to Europe and thence to North America have been established the great currents of commercial exchanges. We of the present age are witnessing the enlarging of old business ties between the western coast along the Pacific with the countries of the Orient.

For more than a decade we of the North American continent have been paying more attention to the possibilities of trade with our southern neighbors to our mutual advantage. We have furnished our share of professional and business men and capital in developments that are rapidly being realized.

Add to these factors the service of air mail with all the possibilities it affords and we bring measurably nearer the full realization of the ultimate benefits that may be expected between the North and South American intercourse.

Best Editorial of the Day

ALL YEAR GARDENS

Swedish horticulturists are turning to horticulture by the use of artificial light. The "plant water" is usually covered by glass, but sometimes with thin layers and all sorts of fresh vegetables are to be had from the light-grown experiment gardens. It is already wanted in the north and furnished the artificial sunlight to make this possible. In one plant operation in flowers—16 thousand tulips—1200 were raised in the light-grown experiment gardens during the month of January. The cost of the current amounted to only 1 per cent of the commercial value of the plants.

There are three hundred such electro-horticultural enterprises throughout Sweden. The government maintains a special institute and laboratory for scientific research and has given other generous assistance to the movement. Prof. Sven Oden of Stockholm, a pioneer in the movement, forecasts the time when Swedish gardeners will be practically independent of seasonal changes, Swedish, concentrating on peacetime pursuits, is already an international leader in the field, and has been for some time.

French scientists some months ago produced electrically-illuminated strawberries in a fraction of the time necessary for ordinary growth. The berries were larger and more luscious than the common varieties. There was one prohibitive factor to commercial cultivation—they had cost about 35 cents a pound.

Sweden is the matter of heating the earth. The substitution of electric light for sunlight is a more complete problem with the experiment in these garden results have been obtained, however, in this department as well. The world should look on an eye on the Swedish scientists for making the earth yield its fruits regardless of weather.

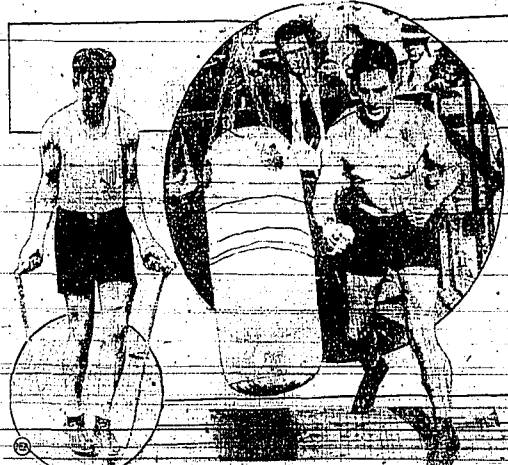

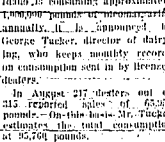

Department of Agriculture Report Says Gem State Uses a Million Pounds Each Year

BURKE, Sept. 25 (Special Telegram)—In the first preliminary report of the department of agriculture indicates that Idaho is consuming approximately 1,000,000 pounds of margarine annually, it is announced by George Tucker, director of dairy and stock raising, in a report on consumption sent in by breeders' dealers.

In August 217 dealers out of 215 reported sales of 62,227 pounds of the milk-borne fat. Tucker estimates the total consumption at 35,700 pounds that Idaho is now by the fact that butter manufacturers 22 million pounds of creamery butter annually to which seven million pounds of condensed milk are added. In other words there are seven times as much butter consumed in Idaho as elsewhere.

The department's records show that the great bulk of margarine is consumed in northern Idaho.

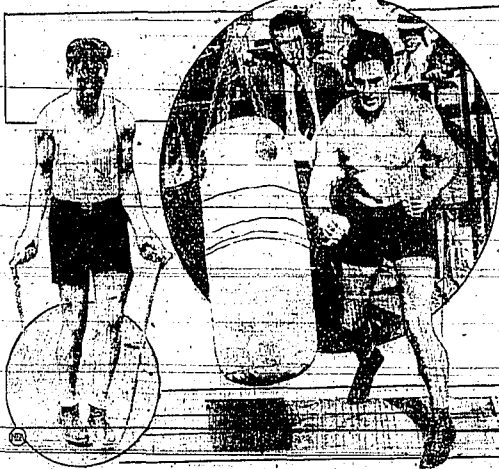

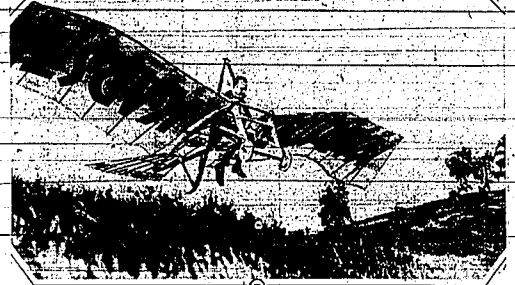
