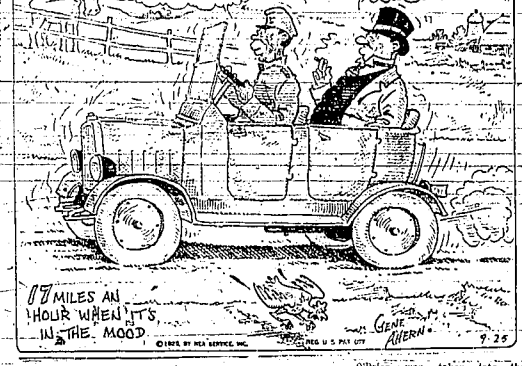

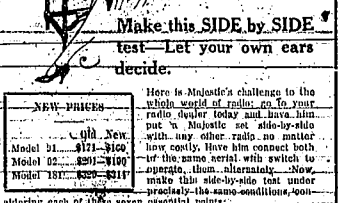

GOOD WILL TOURS

MANY communities find it advantageous, both to themselves and to their neighboring districts, to conduct good-will tours once in a while.

IF Twin Falls ever has followed this practice, we do not know of it.

The criticism may be made that the underlying idea of such a practice is selfish in that those making the tour are seeking to increase their own business contacts with the idea of adding to their business. Primarily, this is just about the case, but the final results are usually more significant than the admission would indicate.

A community that consciously goes out of its way to be friendly can count on receiving as much, or more, than it gives. An effort to learn more of the trading area of which Twin Falls is the center would undoubtedly yield more value in the information gained than the cost in effort would be.

Who in Idaho, need to be better acquainted. Mew, who but a few weeks ago himself was rescued after being lost for 18 days.
