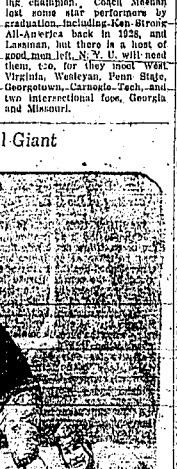

OUR RAILROAD CUTOFF THE decision of the interstate commerce commission in the Rogerson-Wells cutoff case has several points of real significance to this rich agricultural section of Idaho.

Another is that the present commodity rates were left undisturbed on a basis that this district considers high. Still, another is that the Portland class rates are lower than the new San Francisco rates.

Portland as an outlet for a part of our big volume of freight shipments may consider her position satisfactory as regards this Twin Falls country in Idaho, even in the face of the recent class rates reduction we secured on movements to San Francisco.

One advantage that is Portland has is that she is able to throw her energies into an effort that undoubtedly now will be made to secure construction of an extension of the Minnoka-Buhl branch line west and slightly north to connect with the main line to the Union Pacific System.

Present Portland bound freight from this branch which serves the Twin Falls country must go east to Minnoka and then be back hauled. The main line and the Minnoka-Buhl branch line both run in a general easterly-westerly direction.

Portland's best interests demand that she be alive to the necessity of providing the benefits of this cutoff with the reduction in mileage that Oregon port needs to procure her share of

our traffic in the face of an ever increasing demand from California ports and distributing centers.

A VETERAN'S MYSTERY IT WOULD be interesting to know what the story was that George Marbo of Schenectady, N. Y., carried to his grave with him.

NUMBERS FOR THE PILOTS THE aeronautics branch of the Department of Commerce, seeking to aid aerial navigation by having all air routes plainly marked, suggested that automobile highways be marked for the benefit of aviators.

It proposes that the regular automobile route numbers be painted on main highways in letters 20 or 30 feet long, so that they would be visible from a considerable height.

It sounds like a good idea. The numbering of automobile routes has proven an ineliminable boon to the motorist. Touring in a state which pays decent attention to the job of setting up the numbered route markers is a delight.

The practice of marking off the traffic lines on the streets within the city of Twin Falls with painted lines in the center of the streets is wholly commendable, and whoever suggested and worked out the plan is entitled to praise.

FROM THE PUBLIC PARKING RESTRICTIONS Twin Falls, Idaho, Oct. 11, 1929 Editor Evening Times:

In submitting the following comments upon the parking restriction of Twin Falls, I am taking the stand of many of our business men as well as that of a customer of customers who do business in the city of Twin Falls. I find after making a careful study of the different types of customers that it is highly probable an average of two hours for the outsider, who drives to town to complete his business.

After talking with several of the business men of Twin Falls, I find that the restrictive regulations in favor of the parking restriction are far in excess of what the space in the restricted blocks for the use of the business men. However, they will only allow a definite time for the use of the lot. I find that sixty minutes roll around the clock in a very short time. 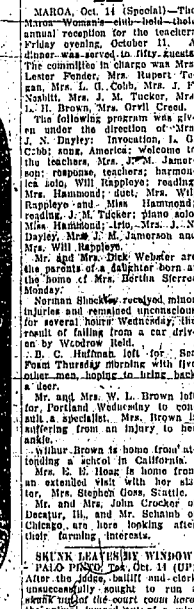
