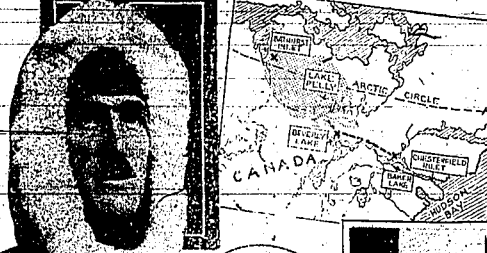



GREETINGS TEACHERS—From eight counties in this district of Idaho will begin assembling here this afternoon for the first session of the institute that is to be held in Twin Falls Friday morning.

Twin Falls is happy to be host to this splendid body of teachers. To a very large part of the public the profession of teaching is likely to be considered as too much of a thankless job.

Teaching is one of the professions that exact much in the way of contribution from the teacher. Judged by some of the other professions, it is sometimes claimed that the returns are not commensurate with the energy, skill and devotion exacted.

If it is true that the teacher receives a not too great stipend in cash nor public recognition in any measurable degree, it is also true that those engaged in teaching have the privilege of doing one of the most important tasks that society presents. Payment to the teacher comes in the consciousness of having aided in developing sound character, directing enthusiasms and shaping careers.

STOP THE GRAFT THE federal government recently uncovered the existence of a mammoth bootlegging syndicate by one series of raids in different cities in the east.

Profits over a six month period amounted to \$2,000,000, federal officials stated. Directors in the organization met once a week around an oak table to discuss problems and to declare dividends. Operations were on a wide scale and in real volume.

Of unusual interest to the government were notations in two of the seized books, indicating that large sums, often running into five figures, were paid as protection to local officials in New Jersey.

The illegal traffic was, made possible, or at least aided, by corrupt officials. Now graft has existed since organized government, and it is too much to expect that it will be eliminated to day or tomorrow, but action against these leeches should be started.

In connection with military or naval business of the nation, giving aid and comfort to the enemy becomes treason and is punished. Officials, whether local, state or federal, who accept graft money are in a very real sense enemies of their country.

During war times, persons who indicated any intention of giving aid and comfort to the enemy were dealt with summarily, sometimes officially, but as often as not unofficially, yet legally, by their fellow citizens.

Public opinion was the heavy club that forced action against enemies, and public opinion needs to be organized and put to work today.

DEMAND THE BLUE CARD

JUST THE OTHER DAY contributions in the amount of several hundred dollars were secured from local firms and individuals by two men under circumstances that open up the whole question of the desirability of making donations to strangers.

The two men were arrested before they had been in Twin Falls long on request of officials at Idaho Falls and were then returned to Idaho Falls to face a misdemeanor charge.

The strangers made their solicitation without the blue card that denotes that a case has been investigated and approved by a special committee of the chamber of commerce. Those from whom they secured their funds did not insist on seeing their blue card. That much is evident.

It is to the credit of a community to be reasonably generous in the matter of according worthy causes support, but there certainly is no reason why money should be thrown away. There is every reason why a cause should be carefully investigated before funds are solicited in its behalf.

The money that is available for gifts should all be put to creditable uses. This case again illustrates the wisdom of being guided by the blue card system where gifts are handed out to strangers. The chamber of commerce has no desire except to give everyone a square deal when it comes to solicitation. It does not desire to discriminate against worthy causes which have a legitimate claim against the community. On the other hand, it does wish to protect Twin Falls firms and individuals against professional solicitors whose causes are not deserving.

When a stranger comes into a place of business seeking funds, the safe, proper and right thing to do is to ask to see his blue card. If he does not have the card, he may be an impostor—and the pathway for imposters should be made more difficult, not easier.

JAILING A SHERIFF

The pains for pampering prisoners exacted by Sheriff James A. Frederickson, Fremont county, who has been fined \$500 and sentenced to serve three months in the Benewalla county jail for allowing federal prisoners to escape during the last year, were supposed to be discharging their debt for violations of various laws. When the became too large for the sheriff's jail, testimony showed, went filling, journey to Portland to see their relatives, and other wise took life easy as expected under the federal government. Frederickson may not have known what was going on, but that has nothing to do with the matter. The sheriff should have known that when a man went to jail to do time for a crime, it was his duty to look him up and allow him the freedom of the country.

Jails are no longer places of punishment. Instead they are public houses of prostitution where bootleggers, check artists, vagrants and those guilty of greater offenses are kept in luxury, fed two or three good meals a day, spend their time reading and playing cards, and at night sleep on reasonable soft beds. Tender hearted sheriffs grant them certain other liberties in the way of children and company and in many cases give them 24 hours out in the sunshine each day. This is what our prison system has deteriorated into. Instead of punishing men who have violated the laws of the state we are pampering them as though they were some of the idle rich. The man who is out of work, either through choice or force of circumstances, has to count some trivial offense to get in jail and find in the lap of luxury for a stated period. 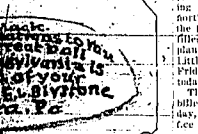

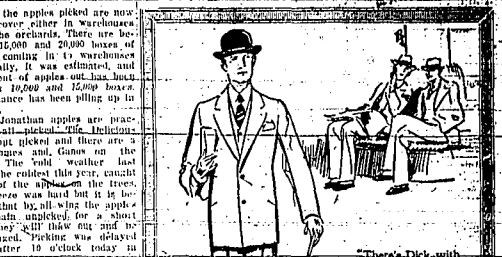

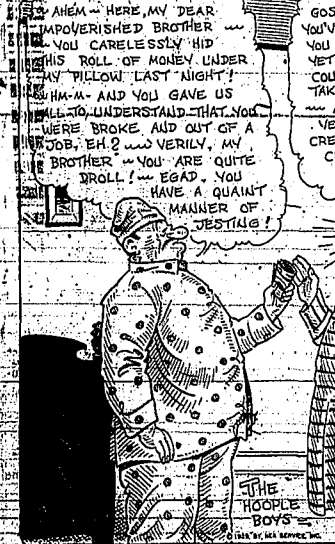

Are 600 Cows in 99 Herd of Improvement Association Tested During September

There were 140 cows out of the 600 cows in the 99 herds tested by the University Dairy Herd Improvement association during the month of September that produced at least 25 pounds of butterfat and 60 pounds of milk according to the report of W. J. Byrne, official tonier.

High in the large herd division was the one of 28 Holsteins and Jerseys owned by John Gott of Twin Falls, producing an average of 32 pounds of butterfat and 866 pounds of milk. In the medium size class the herd of 31, Pastors of Roth, with 11 grade Jerseys, was high with 58.5 pounds of butterfat and 871 pounds of milk. In the small herd class George Evans of Eden, with five registered Holsteins, was high with 44.4 pounds of butterfat and 110 pounds of milk.

HOME OF DAVID BUSHNELL

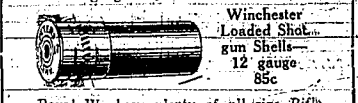
