JURY'S PAINTICES GUILT OF ASSAULT

Verdict Reached After 53 Hours Deliberation; Calls For 1 to 50 Years in Pen

Sentence Will be Pronounced on November 1; Daughter of Theatre Magnate Breaks Down; Counsel Will Move for New Trial

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 28 (UP)—Alexander Pantage, for years the leading figure in the world of the theatre, played a losing role in his greatest drama and as a result must spend from one to fifty years in San Quentin penitentiary. A jury of 12 women and five men late last night found him guilty of assaulting 17-year-old Eunice Pringle. The prison term was mandatory. The jury deliberated 53 hours. The daughter of a Greek multimillionaire will be called before Superior Judge Charles Fricke on November 1 for sentence. At that time his attorneys will present motion for a new trial and file notice of appeal.

The verdict was returned in which his wife Mrs. Lois Pantage was found guilty of manslaughter a month ago. The jury preferred the word of Mrs. Pringle, an amateur dancer and former coo, to that of the defendant. She was fined \$25,000,000. She claimed that Pantage, on the night of the assault, had been drunk and had been plotting to "blackmail" him.

The scene which attracted the jury's attention was dramatic. Pantage, master showman who had been seen for 48 hours when it was announced he had been arrested. When Judge Fricke went to the bench and the defendant was at his place, the former read: "We, the jury, find the defendant guilty of assault with a deadly weapon. We further recommend the mercy of the court."

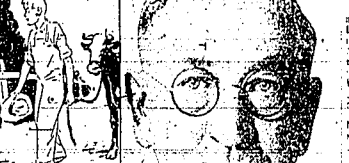

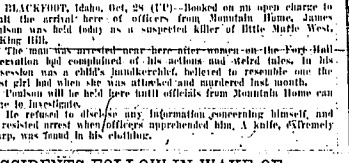

California teams also have good record but they have been tied once this year.

There was just one question that northern California football fans are asking themselves today, after the outcome of the Stanford vs. University of Southern California game. It was "What are the California chances of taking the national title?"

At first glance it would appear that the U. S. C. showed in an almost impregnable position after its 7 to 0 victory over the Cardinals.

But at second thought, California is covered a fighting chance to come out on top. The fighting team took on the powerful Olympic club with their second string after a five-day trip from Philadelphia, and beat the club 21 to 19. Stanford, earlier in the season selected the Olympics 4 to 0.

"Nils Price, California's coach, with most of his best first string men, saw the Stanford game, and had a fine chance to size up U. S. C. players while the southerners have had no opportunity to follow California for the past three weeks in the same way."

California has always been a second half team. They have strength, and have probably a better defense than Stanford. If the second string could beat the Olympic club, there is every chance that the first string can give U. S. C. a very interesting time at Saturday.

Stanford and U. S. C. are the only undefeated teams in the conference although California was tied in a non-conference game with St. Mary's.
