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It Is Time To Get Busy

THE railroad running into Twin Falls should be extended westward to a connection with the main line of the Union Pacific at some feasible junction point. That extension when brought about will be of vastly greater benefit than is generally realized. Here are the reasons:

1. The distance by rail from Twin Falls to north Pacific points will be reduced approximately 125 miles.

2. The distance by rail from Boise and the Boise country to California, with direct service through Twin Falls and Wells, will be reduced approximately 264 miles.

If it is good business to finish a gap on an important highway why does not the same thing apply to railroad building?

If the principle of service means what people claim for it in this modern age of ethical business standards and co-operation we endeavor have we not a right to expect the line extension? How can anyone claim that good railroads calls for arbitrarily keeping this territory 124 miles farther than it should be from the western seaboard.

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Former Cabinet Man Also Ordered to Pay \$100,000 Fine; New Trial Is Denied

Suspension of Sentence Is Not Granted by Justice Hitz; Disqualification From Public Office Mandatory Upon Conviction

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (UP)—Former Secretary of the Interior Albert B. Fall was sentenced today to carry one year and fined \$100,000 by Justice William Hitz following his conviction on a charge of having accepted a bribe from E. J. Doherty, multi-millionaire California oil man, in connection with the Elk Hills oil reserve leases.

Fall, who has been ill with lung trouble and whose condition threatened to cause a miscarriage, was not granted suspension of the sentence.

It was the first time in American history that a former cabinet officer has been sentenced to jail for a felony committed while in office.

Sentence was imposed after Justice Hitz had overruled motions for a new trial and for arrest of the judgment against Fall.

Disqualification of Fall from holding public office although not mentioned by the judge in his sentencing follows automatically under the Espionage Act.

There was no demonstration by those who had gathered close to the courtroom when sentence was read by the 47-acre field, for a total of \$100,000.


POTATO MARKET LITTLE CHANGED

CARELESSNESS IN THE AUTO.

THE motorist, once or a while, is guilty of amazing thoughtlessness. In Massachusetts the other day a man was driving down a busy city street when the accelerator of his car stuck. Instead of throwing out his clutch promptly and bringing his car to a stop with the foot brake before trying to fix this motorist simply bent forward while the car continued in motion and tried to pull the pedal up with his fingers.

The result? His head went below the level of the bottom of the windshield and he could not see where he was going. The car swept along at a terrific rate until it struck a railway repair tower, killing one man and injuring another.

Such carelessness is almost unbelievable. Yet it is a safe bet that nearly all of us, at some time or another, do something nearly as foolish.

The man at the wheel of an automobile owes it to his fellows to keep his vigilance keyed up every second.

UNORDERED GOODS

THIS is the season of the year when high pressure salesmen use the mails in an effort to find all kinds of small merchandise on customers. Residents in this district have been embarrassed by receiving Christmas cards, stockings, neckties and other merchandise with a request to send back dollars or more in payment or else return the package.

This practice has grown to such alarming proportions that congress has before it a measure, known as the House Bill No. 743, intended to give relief to those who have been pestered with unordered merchandise. It is hoped that this bill will be passed in such a form that it will do away with entirely this unfair method of selling.

Certainly the buyer has a right to select that which he wishes to buy. Certainly he cannot determine whether to receive a package through the mail when the contents of that package are unknown to him till he does receive it. Even if the postman says it on his step, leaves it in his mail box, that constitutes delivery under the rulings of the post office department and the present laws might hold him liable if he used the goods without paying, even though he did not order them.

But for a practical method of stopping this abuse he need not wait until this proposed law is in force. He need not go to the trouble of wrapping up the goods for return, or affixing stamps for that purpose, even though those stamps are sent him with the unordered goods—which they seldom are. The applying of a stamped addressed return package by the sender does not obligate the recipient of unordered merchandise to devote his time and effort for its return.

The National Better Business Bureau has secured legal opinions that so long as unordered goods are not used by the recipient, he need neither return them nor pay for them. The most they can ask, according to their advice, is that the recipient hold such unordered merchandise ready for return to a properly accredited representative of the sender when he calls. Further, only a reasonable length of time need be allowed before the recipient might have a legitimate claim for storage charges on this unordered merchandise.

If all who received unordered greeting cards, for instance, were to simply follow the course recommended by the Better Business Bureau, they would soon cease to be pestered by having inferior products sent them. It is natural that these unordered goods should be inferior because the losses by this method of selling are enormous, and the recipient who pays for any unordered merchandise is paying for the goods which some other recipient neither paid for nor returned.

AUTOMOBILE REGISTRATIONS.

FOR 1928 there were 21,370,125 passenger automobiles registered in the states of the United States.

In 1929, automobile registration amounted to 23,225,850. The percentage of increase from 1920 until 1928, therefore, was 100.

For 1928 passenger automobile registrations for Idaho were 96,960, or at the rate of 178 per 1,000 inhabitants. The increase in Idaho was from a registration of 46,541 in 1920, and the percentage of increase from 1920 to 1928 was 108.

In the United States as a whole there are 179 passenger automobiles for each 3,000 inhabitants.

The state of New York has the greatest number of passenger automobiles, 1,760,000, with California a close second with 1,582,000. Other states that have a million or more passenger automobiles are Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Texas.






