BOISE, Nov. 4 (UP)—Failure to convert for the extra point after a much-contested defeat for the Twin Falls high school football team, today, Saturday afternoon, the Bears threw a stumbling block in the way of a 6-7 Twin Falls made 147 yards from scrimmage and three goals 124 yards.

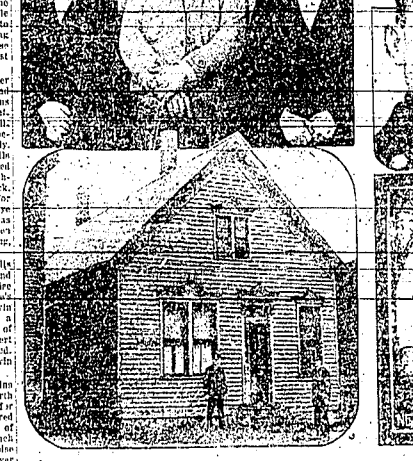

COME INTO THE KITCHEN

"How the devil did the apple in?" Apple dumplings! What rhapsodies could be written about them! They are the most delicious of our old days—only the like of which would put skyrake and water levels clear in the shade—crusty sauce—balls with plum liqueur—safety, but which washed in a sauce fit for the gods! Who said the recipe was lost with our youth and supplanted with a mixture of unattainable Frenchness? Far be it from me to preach, my dear, but such a dish, burnt upon the finest conscientiousness of the century, (Horrible! Horrible! Horrible!) should be the most delightful addition to their diet—

Old-Fashioned Apple-Dumplings

Make a rich biscuit dough of 2 cups sifted flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 3-4 cup sweet milk (evaporated). (Sour milk with 1/2 teaspoon soda—sifted—and 2 teaspoons baking powder may be used instead of the sweet milk.) Mix dry ingredients and shortening with fork till out to about one-fourth inch in thickness.

Put apple, core, place on a piece of dough and fill center of apple with sugar and cinnamon or nutmeg. Wrap dough around apple and pinch ends together. In which dumplings in boiling water. In which there is also a cup or two of boiling water (given below). Bake in hot oven (450 degrees) until apples are done. (Quantity of time will vary with type of apple and size.) Serve with remainder of hot sauce.

*** Sauce

Mix together 1 cup of sugar, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/4 teaspoon of salt. Pour on slowly 2 cups of boiling water. Boil 5 minutes. Add one tablespoon butter and remove with dash of nutmeg or one-half teaspoon lemon extract or juice.
