THERE MAY BE A LESSON Idaho Statesman

These who control the destinies of public utilities for the most part, freed by legislation of competition, have come to view problems in entirely different light from other business men. If John Jones, merchant, desires to raise the price of pink night gowns he has only to raise the price, but if he is a public utility he thinks before raising the rate that step, quite obviously it will do him no good to raise the price of pink night gowns if by so doing he makes pink night gowns so expensive that the demand for them is killed.

But since competition virtually has been done away with, the manager of our public utilities approach the same problem with different psychology. "If they have to take our product," seems to be their argument, "so it is up to us to get the very highest price which the public utilities commission (or whatever is the name of the commission regulating such rates) can be persuaded to authorize."

But it does not always work out this way if we are to believe the reported findings of the California state railroad commission which would lead to the conclusion that in street car fares rates, at least, a 5 cent fare is more profitable than a higher fare.

The commission reported that a state wide survey showed the experience of every traction company in California to be that when fares are increased patronage decreases and total receipts fall off.

Illustrating the futility of raising fares to stimulate income, the Los Angeles railway is shown to have experienced a 12 per cent decrease in travel, lines increasing its

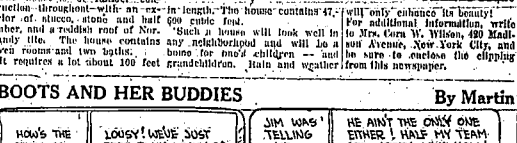

Eskimo Trapper Hero in Rescue of McAlpine Party

DEFIES DEATH TO FIND EXPLORERS LOST IN ARCTIC

whose indomitable courage made possible the finding of a radio message Monday across the frozen wastes of the Arctic that the long missing McAlpine expedition party was alive and safe at an isolated Hutson bay trading post.

On September 3, Col. C. D. H. McAlpine, president of the Dominion Explorers, led an expedition in two airplanes with seven companions in quest of a fabulous rich copper deposit on the shores of the Arctic ocean.

The following day the pilot, blinded by fog, became lost and after flying for hours over the open waters of the sea landed on their craft near Melbourne Island in Queen Maud's bay.

For days they huddled about the Eskimo trapper, whose Arctic life fortunately was equipped with that magic instrument of communication—the radio—one day from the air.

In this trapper's igloo miles away at the Eskimo sometimes listening to the radio—his only

communication with the outside. It was from this magic box that McAlpine and his mates were told somewhere in the endless wastes of the Arctic that the Eskimo had come to find them.

After days and nights of tramping the military outfit of last came upon the explorers located in their prison camp by the open ice of the gulf between them and Cambridge Bay.

Food—Scarcely a morsel was left and it was the Eskimo who brought in what little the party had to eat by his hunting and trapping skill.

Finally the gulf was safely frozen over and taking only 400 pounds of the eight men and their guide started the long tramp over the rough pack to the Hutson bay post.

Progress was slow and painful—125 miles were required to cover the 60 miles and the grueling tramp was made under the most perilous circumstances.

McAlpine was said to have just 40 pounds of weight in his pack. McAlpine and his men were given a royal welcome when they reached the trading post where Ian MacInnes, radio operator, finished out the message to the world Monday that they were alive and safe.
