

**IDAHO TO THE FORE**  
PRODUCTION of turkeys was heavy in Idaho this year, but one of the biggest shipping stations undoubtedly was our neighboring town of Gooding which sent out seven carloads of the birds for the Thanksgiving market. The cash received by growers for these birds amounted to about \$50,000, according to news in this newspaper from Gooding published Tuesday evening.

The business of raising turkeys is still largely a sideline, but the fact that one grower at Gooding received a check for \$1,000 indicates that the sideline has grown to such proportions that it brings in much more than just small change. Nearly every community has been adding to its income in recent years by the sale of turkeys.

Up in the Burley district a lot of farms have been changing hands. Some new farmers are responsible for a part of the buying, and some new purchasers are by men who have been renting.

Over at Jerome activity in land is reported to be more pronounced than for many years. Some of the purchasers there, at Burley, are new comers, and in other cases renters are setting up in business on land they have just bought. An appreciable number of farm sales are being made in this district.

Old wooden pipe repair has been under way some time now, but money enough to meet the city's needs, the report makes plain, is done about it, and the report goes rather far in the matter of initiation.
