# Local News in Brief

## POTATO MARKET

### IMPROVEMENT IS NOTED SLIGHTLY

Prices fluctuating considerably during past ten day period; late rally in cen.

Potato market conditions showed some improvement during early part of this period, according to Idaho Falls reports.

During the early part of this period, conditions were generally very low in most terminals but light shipments reflected in receipts and general confidence turned up a shade. Track holdings of potatoes declined steadily through the past week.

The Chicago market reported a much better condition in the market during the middle of the past week and prices advanced around 10 cents on Idaho Russet. Fancy stock sold at a range of prices sometimes 50 cents above normal quotations. Demand was reported slow in that quarter during the greater part of this time but heavier supplies changed the tone of conditions. The Southern California market, as reflected by Los Angeles quotations, was active during the first few days of this period but heavy receipts in that terminal caused a slump in both demand and prices, especially on ordinary stock. Track holdings at Los Angeles declined during the close of the period of what they were at the opening. Light shipments from Washington helped the situation in Northern California somewhat and liberal supplies of Idaho potatoes were moved into that section.

Texas market was very noisy during the early part of this time, and prices advanced considerably during that period, but prices at Idaho slipping points reflected this weakness. Kansas City trade was active for this reason of the year and sales so nearby points in southern territory held a fair volume. St. Louis was inactive during the greater part of this time. Track holdings have shown a depressing effect on the market.

In the Idaho Falls section prices fluctuated considerably, opening an inch or more below normal at \$1.20-20 per cwt. track, and the market fell declining to \$1.00-20 and again to \$1.00-10. But track prices on Russet opened at \$1.00-10 on eastern points, declined to \$1.00-10 on local points and to \$1.00-10 on the coast. California pack Russet were hardly a market. Idaho Russet were in demand generally sold a shade above after showing a decline at the opening of this period. Prices were \$1.00-10 and slightly higher at the close.

 HOOPER-PROSPERITY-ENGINEER  
 Chairman Science Monitor

The dynamic leadership which President Hoover is bringing to the whole of the stock market hysteria is certain to have an immediate and nation-wide effect on business. The specific plans for the support and extension of American prosperity have been under consideration at the White House for some months, and the result, as we know, has furnished an urgent crisis in Wall Street in which to give them effect. The President's conferences this week with leaders of labor, industry and finance—his decision to reorganize millions of dollars worth of public money, looking upon an unsteady first step in a larger economic program.

The essential purpose of Mr. Hoover's initiative is not to rescue a speculative market from pitfalls of its own creating, but to prevent business from plunging into depressions. There is every reason to believe that he will be successful in his efforts because he is building on a sound foundation. The Nation possesses an abundance of men, money, materials, and business capacity to produce. What it needs at the moment is an increasing capacity to consume. The problem is not one of overproduction, but as Mr. Ford has put it, an under-producing power. It is this need which President Hoover's program of business co-ordination will help greatly to provide.

Behind the President's timely plans rests the economic fact that the money used for the production of goods is not always sufficient to finance their consumption. This may not be a novel discovery in the field of economic theory, but under the impetus of practical economists, with the support of President Hoover, has given leaders in the United States designed to fight in the keeping the flow of money to consumers in step with the flow of goods which consumers would like to buy. The recent collapse in stocks has served to concentrate the wealth of the country in the hands of few individuals, and is also tending to look up with the key to apprehension resources which should otherwise be devoted to active enterprise. Such a condition, therefore, accentuates the handicap placed upon the consuming power.

The Federal Government, by allocating several million dollars for expenditure in construction, is promoting consuming power at the time when it is most needed to be promoted.

It is interesting to note that the work at the moment when its building costs will be at the least expensive. For these two reasons—over-state and city government, as well as private business, will do well to co-operate with the President in allocating their public works expenditures for this period. The continuation of the Nation's dominant railroad and steamship construction programs to proceed at once with maximum construction programs to avoid any retrenchment in employment sets an example in business co-ordination which should be widely followed.

It has been well said that in order to be prosperous today we must prepare to be prosperous tomorrow. The President's plans are clearly based upon these sound lines.

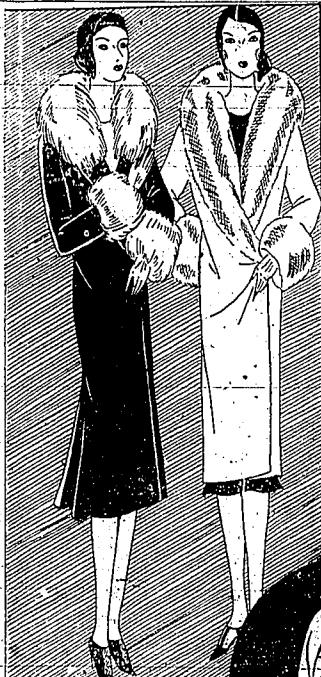

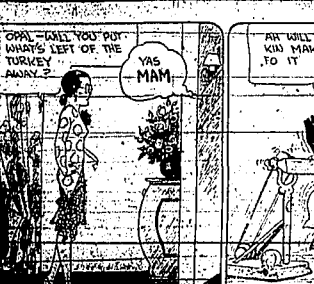

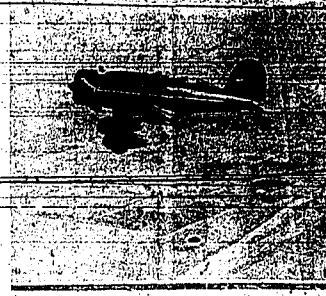
