CAPE CHARLES, Va., Dec. 2.—(UP)—Ten dead and more than a score injured was the toll today of a derailment of a Pennsylvania decision train at Onley, 35 miles north of here, early Sunday.

PROSPECTS FOR BUSINESS GOOD IN COMING YEAR

Enormous Construction Program Expected To Be Carried Out

NO FEAR OF RECESSION IN 1930

Automobile and Steel Industries Furnish Only Sources of Worry

NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—(UP)—Expectations of new construction programs in the United States during the coming year approximating \$3,000,000,000 have obtained, according to reports from various federal reserve centers.

Headquarter stability in trade is reported in several districts, while slight recessions in others are defined as a natural result of the rearm-breaking pace of midsummer.

Attention of the business world during the past week has centered on President Hoover's business confidence at the White House. Chiefly leaders expressed opinion of the nation's business by their opinion of the "boom" program amount of 1930 construction programs totaling nearly \$2,000,000,000.

It was pointed out that leaders in this industry have no fear of a trade recession during the coming year notwithstanding reduced activity in both the automobile and steel industries at the present time.

A further slight decrease in loading of revenue freight loads in the week of November 16 is a holiday week, was largely expected.

About the only source of anxiety at the present time are the automobile and steel industries. Actively in the former is, below a past age due to new model changes and inventory taking at an earlier period than last year, while the steel industry is experiencing a seasonal slackening following record breaking activity. Automobile production is expected to be stimulated by the coming winter showing of new models.

SUSPECTED TRAIN BANDIT-ARRESTED IN SOUTHERN CITY

Tom Vernon, 44, Jailed at Pawloo, Oklahoma, Charged With Wrecking Trains

PAWNEE, Okla., Dec. 2.—(UP)—Tom Vernon, 44, who had kept jail beyond reach of a deputy sheriff as the two moved through half a dozen states, was in jail here today charged with wrecking two trains and robbing passengers.

Deputy Sheriff Thomas J. Higgins of Los Angeles charged Vernon with wrecking the Southern Pacific near Sallis, Calif. Vernon, 44, was accompanied by Sheriff Gus Horn of Cheyenne, Wyo., who charged the prisoner with a similar wreck and robbery at Cheyenne a week ago. Both officers said they had positively identified Vernon, alias Tom Bretherton, former inmate performer and kidnaper, as the train robber.

Extradition applications will be forwarded to the governor, the officers said, and the governor's decision will determine what charge Vernon will face first.

SAILORS DIE IN BAD STORM ON LAKE SUPERIOR

Six Seamen Perish; Blizzard One of Worst Known on Great Lakes

GRAIN STEAMER KIOWA FOUNDS ON THE ROCKS

Supervisors, Taken Off by Rescuees, Almost Dead, From Exposure

SARLT STE., Muske, Mich., Dec. 2.—(UP)—The battered hull of the grain steamer, Kiowa, pounding on the rocks of Sable Point in Lake Superior today, laid graphically of a winter tragedy of the inland seas in which six sailors perished Saturday night in one of the most ferocious blizzards ever known on the Great Lakes.

Rescuees of east guardmen, who labored mountainous waters and treacherous rocks to get a life across the Kiowa's bow, and other life aboard, the survivors, almost dead from exposure and exhaustion, were transferred from the wave-lashed wreck to the lulling boats of the rescuers by breeches buoy.

Captain Alex T. Young, commander of O. W. Hodicki, president of the O. W. Hodicki company, owner of the Kiowa, was among the dead.

The four sailors were drowned. One, a Helocet, they had launched capsized, according to the survivors. With him, they said, were the ship's cook, the wheelman, watchman and porter. The sixth sailor was "lost" dead in the sea.

The cargo of flax seed in the Kiowa—shipped as the storm tossed the craft about like a tin can, drifted and made her unmanageable, survivors said.

The Kiowa left Duluth, Minn., three days ago and was due here yesterday. When a tug picked up in a blizzard stamped with the ship's name and bearing the body of a dead sailor, coast guardmen put out in the storm to search.

They came upon the half-submerged craft at dusk. Breakers were riding late against the rocks like a battering ram. The coast guardmen fought for hours before the last sailor was brought off safely. Darkness fell soon after rescue efforts began and hampered the men.

WHY PICK ON BEANS... FREIGHT tariffs on dried beans seem to have been fixed with the idea of providing a maximum benefit for the railroads without much consideration for the producers.

Beans are as little trouble to the railroad as any commodity that is handled. Wheat is bulk crop, but when it is shipped in bulk tight cars must be provided.

Why is it, then, that the railroads realize in many cases twice as much revenue per car from hauling beans as from hauling potatoes on which Idaho can testify the rates are just on the verge of being confiscatory?

Now potatoes make the railroads money even though they are shipped in refrigerator cars and have to be loaded and their delivery expedited to the maximum.

As contrasted to our rate on beans to Portland consider some of the California rates. From San Francisco to Salt Lake City, 817 miles, the rate on a 40,000 minimum car is 67 cents.

From Bakersfield to Salt Lake City, 999 miles the bean rate on a 40,000 pound car is \$21.2 cents, or the cost of the car is \$330. In other words for 40,000 car load of beans can be moved from Bakersfield to Salt Lake City, 999 miles, for 298 miles further than from Twin Falls to Portland for \$10 less than a 40,000-pound carload of

beans can be moved from Twin Falls to Portland. Not only are beans required to pay a high tariff irrespective of which origin they are shipped, but Twin Falls is bound down with rates that compel this district to ship east.

CHRISTMAS CREDITS AMONG adults there may be discerned at times a whispered remonstrance against the Christmas season. On occasion the whisper may even become stronger and emerge as a full voiced complaint delivered, however, to a small audience.

Our answer is that it all depends. If one thinks only of what one is giving, and what one spends for the gifts, then the whisperer has a case. But the poet gave us the truth that "the gift without the giver is bare," and on the basis that the most important angle of Christmas is that it puts us out of our usual lethargy and causes us to give of our love to others we are still championing Christmas.

And don't forget the children in this consideration, because it is their season in the main, and the loss of Christmas would be their loss in far greater measure than that it could ever be the gain of their elders. What fun they have in these days preceding Christmas!

Some of them are permitted to believe in Santa Claus as a reality. Others know him for the myth he is but talk of him, their eyes twinkling as if he were a fairy. All of them, we hope, are wondering what gifts Christmas will bring them. May none of them be disappointed!

If the joy of anticipation on the part of children is confined largely to those fortunate homes where children are found, some of the manifestations of joy may be seen by anyone who walks the streets and keeps eyes open to what is going on. Watch the children window shop. How real and unadulterated their interest and what joy is theirs in selecting the gifts!

Christmas has its compensations, even to the whisperers. Children love the season, and poor indeed are the rest of us for a little while we can not forget the passing of the years and see the world through their untroubled eyes.

Cold weather is bringing deaths to the mid-west section of the United States. That is another good reason why Idaho, should be inhabited by a million people, instead of by less than half that number.

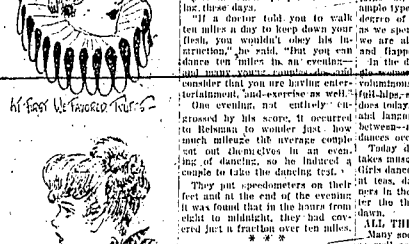
