## REDUCED BROKER LOANS EASE CREDIT PROBLEM

OUR of the chronic sight of real estate market liquidation have entered a new constructive phase. One of these has been the decline in loans to brokers. This has had the effect of holding greater cash in the right situation. A development essential to the success of a real estate market is the presence of a large number of brokers. This is a feature of the industry on an even keel.

Before the stock price crash, the first number of loans to brokers was becoming increasingly scarce in this country and in Europe. The same danger was in the form of brokers' loans were used to carry stocks on credit.
