

South Idaho Set For Opening of Basketball Season

AMENDMENTS TO ATHLETIC RULES GIVEN NO FAVOR

Plans made in Shoshone meet for tournament in both boys and girls basketball.

The opening of the southern Idaho District Athletic association meeting at Shoshone, Saturday, was the beginning of another basketball season which from the present outlook will last for the next three, four and a half months. The boys and girls will have new coaches, some of the teams are in the process of rebuilding, and we are looking forward with keen interest and expectation as to the probable strength behind these new faces.

At the meeting, presided over by Mr. Gibbs of Kimberly, a short discussion regarding the proposed amendments to the constitution and bylaws of the state athletic association, the amendments originally proposed by Principal Donnan of Boise, related to revision of data regarding eligibility, high school status, and revision of the rules on professionalism to be interpreted as that athletes receiving remuneration for participation in one sport, be ineligible in that sport only. This proposal did not meet with much favor, as it would limit direct opposition to the national ruling on amateurism. The other amendment referred to making it possible for schools to vote by proxy and also making it possible for members of the state board of control to make decisions by mail rather than through meetings. No vote was taken, but the principals were urged to send in their votes to the state association while this week so as to conform with the ruling set by the state association that these votes must be in their hands one week prior to the state meeting. After a motion that the district organize its basketball with the same procedure as last year the members adjourned to their respective groups.

Kimberly held a meeting with the addition of Kimberly to the class A rating, that division now consists of nine schools: Huhl, Burley, Piler, Gooding, Jerome, Kimberly, Oakley, Rupert, and Twin Falls. All five teams in Twin Falls will be entered.

26 SCHOOLS ARE REPRESENTED AT CLASS B MEETING

Tournament to be held last of February and first of March; sub-districts made.

Twenty-six schools were represented in the Class B meeting presided over by Mr. Houser of Hoyarn. To simplify the choice of teams eligible for participation in the class B tournament and proper geographical distribution the district was divided into five sub-districts composed of Alder, Glenn, Ferry, Hagerman, King Hill, Hammett and Wendell; North Side, sub-district composed of Hietrich, Hietrich, Shoshone and Fairfield; Wood River sub-district composed of Bellevue, Carey, Grant and Hilly; Minidoka sub-district composed of Albion, Delta, Hayden, Paul, Arco and Malheur; South Side sub-district composed of Caldwell, Blain, Hansen, Hazelton, Hollister and Murrah. Eight teams are to be entered in the final Class B tournament two from the King Hill sub-district, one from the North Side, one from Wood River, two from the Minidoka and two from the South Side. This manner of choosing their respective sub-districts, representative to Class B teams, of each district in the majority of cases the sub-districts decided to hold tournaments within their own district.

It was decided that the Class B district board of control composed of Mr. Curtis of Wendell, Mr. Houser of Hoyarn and Mr. Huettschler of Paul would determine the place of tournament. The date was set for February 27, 28 and March 1. As in the past the tournament will be double elimination for the boys and single for the girls.
