Explosion Traps Sixty-Five Men in Oklahoma Mine

AIRMEN INJURED AS PLANE DIVES INTO WOODLAND

Borges and Ochal Reach South America Only to Buffer an Accident

PHYSICIANS ORDERED TO SCENE OF MISHAP

Uruguayans and Frenchman Fall to Break Existing Non-Stop Record

NATAL, Brazil, Dec. 17 (UP)—The trans-Atlantic flight of the Uruguayans, Lieut. Col. Tadeo Lara Borges and Capt. Pedro Ochal, was ended today in a crash in a forest 50 miles from Natal, southeast of Natal.

Both fliers were injured. The state government ordered physicians rushed to the town of Santa Antonio near where the plane crashed to render medical aid to the injured aviators.

Crashes in Forest

The plane crashed in the forest of Santa Antonio, a small town 50 miles from Natal, about 40 miles inland from the Brazilian coast.

The sudden jolting which had followed the news that the fliers had succeeded in spanning the Atlantic from Seattle, Spain, was dampened by the news of injury to Lara Borges and his companion.

The flight was the third successful crossing of the Atlantic by a land plane, although it lacked some distance of breaking any records for non-stop flying.

His Second Accident

The accident was the second in Lara Borges' career as a trans-Atlantic flier. In 1927, with three companions, he attempted to span the Atlantic, starting from the Spanish-Brazilian coast. The plane was forced down near the Rio de Oro province in North Africa. The Uruguayans and Frenchman were rescued by Spanish forces after a week in captivity.

They had been reported recently as they followed the north African coast past the scene of Lara Borges' association and had been sighted over the Cape Verde islands early yesterday.

French Aviators Set New Distance Record

PARIS, Dec. 17 (UP)—The French fliers Dieudonne Costes and Paul Goude established a new world's distance record for a closed course when they passed the 4,761 mile mark shortly before 10 o'clock this morning.

The previous record was set by the Italian aviators, Major Arturo Ferrarin and Major Carlo Delprete, who flew 4,760 miles, from Rome to Brazil.

Costes and Goude originally planned to remain aloft only 55 hours but by saving in fuel consumption during the first 3,000 miles they enable them, barring accidents, to remain in the air an additional eight hours adding materially to the total mileage.

The triangular course over which the aviators are flying is approximately 200 miles, and they have averaged 100 miles an hour throughout the flight.

HOOVER OFFERS OUT-OF-TAX AS CHRISTMAS GIFT

All Incomes Affected by Latest Reduction; President Signs Resolution

ANNUAL SERIES OF SLAHERS EXPECTED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (UP)—President Hoover today announced the reduction of income tax rates on individuals and corporations.

Administration officials and legislators who rubbed the new rate reduction through the legislative process in the last few days, expect the "Christmas gift" to stimulate business even more, particularly since it has been passed before the 1930 session of congress.

Signs Resolution

President Hoover signed the Hawley-Smoot resolution, directing the Secretary of Treasury to collect one per cent less than the regular rates on normal dividends and corporation income.

In the first of what President Hoover and Secretary Mellon hope will be an annual series of reductions, the new rates will take effect on January 1, 1930.

CHICAGO, Dec. 17 (UP)—The leader in Chicago's St. Valentine's day massacre, termed by police "the most notorious man in the underworld," was named over-the-nation today because of a confession made by a woman who failed to testify in the trial.

Fred. R. Burke, alias Fred Dane, became excited in an emergency and divulged secrets which would have cost him his life.

These two errors, which have been held against him for several months, were made after Burke had successfully evaded capture in at least 10 instances.

There were 120 men in the St. Valentine's day massacre, and Burke was one of the few who were not killed.

He was arrested in Chicago in 1927, but was released after a few months.

He is now being sought throughout the United States for a law violation.

The quake lasted about 6:20 a. m. and occurred at an estimated distance of 175 miles from New Haven. The direction was not immediately determined.

McALESTER, Okla., Dec. 17 (UP)—The bodies of 59 miners, entombed by the Old Town coal mine near here today after an explosion which killed through its sloping tunnel and sent death droning gas into its wrecked runways.

The men were cut off from communication with the surface, worked to die through to top levels in an attempt to learn their fate.

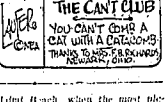

OUR CAUSE IS AIDED

ANNOUNCEMENT of the decision by the interstate commerce commission in the Crane-Crescent case in which the commission has ordered the Union Pacific system to proceed with construction of the railroad to fill this gap in Oregon is a boost to the case of this part of Idaho in its efforts to secure extension west of the Minidoka-Buhl branch.

For the first time in its history the interstate commerce commission has ordered a railroad to build extensive new lines against its will. The ice has been broken. Two commissioners were opposed to the order compelling the construction on the grounds that authority was lacking, but the order was issued.

A test of the commission's authority may be expected in the courts. Irrespective of what such a test discloses, the strength of our cause has been increased. If the courts uphold the commission's authority to order new construction—in this case for 181 miles at a cost of about \$9,000,000—then we can make just as good a cause as Eastern Oregon and Western Idaho made in their fight for the extension. If, by any chance the courts should rule that the commission lacked authority to make the order, the Union Pacific will still be on the defensive and should be required to build the Buhl extension which its representatives have held as an alternative piece of work on at least two occasions.

The Crane-Crescent gap will provide a rail outlet for the territory served into central Oregon and thence into California by way of Klamath Falls, but it will not take the territory on the Minidoka-Buhl branch out of the bottle it now occupies insofar as westbound traffic is concerned.

If the Oregon construction is completed and the dream of E. H. Harrison becomes a reality, the big volume of tonnage in the Twin Falls country will still have an extra haul of more than 100 miles to get to Pacific ports in Oregon and Washington.

The winning by the areas interested in the fight for the Crane-Crescent cutoff strengthens our cause, and that victory should serve as a stimulus to us in pressing our fight with vigor and determination to a successful conclusion. Our position has been improved, and our willingness to make a scrap should be greater now than ever before.

BUHL INITIATIVE

OUR neighboring community, Buhl, has again demonstrated the initiative and public spirit which has marked the community by its action in building a Memorial building. The work was done under the leadership of Buhl post of the American Legion, but all of Buhl participated in the cost, and all of Buhl will share in the benefits that will accrue from the work.

The Buhl Legion post was actuated by the same underlying ambition that has spurred the Twin Falls veterans' organization in its efforts to secure a memorial building here. The post will have the use of the structure for its own purposes, but in addition the Buhl unit of the national guard will also have an armory home under the same roof.

It may be possible for a community

to have so many quasi-public buildings as to be top heavy on this item. We doubt very much that such an accusation could be made to stick in the case of our neighboring city. Certainly, Twin Falls is not guilty of providing more public facilities than are needed. The situation is just the reverse—we have not enough.

The chief reason war veterans of Buhl have a building and Twin Falls never has secured one is due to the fact that the Buhl post went out and got some of the money from the public. The Twin Falls post has been working for some two or three years on the theory that the veterans themselves would provide such a building and that the public should not be bothered with helping to provide funds. The spirit of the Twin Falls group is admirable from one point of view, but there is also the possibility that the public would welcome an opportunity to share in the cost of the venture.

Buhl's new building, formally opened in appropriate ceremonies Monday, is a credit to Buhl post of the American Legion, to the public spirited citizens of Buhl whose aid made the building of the structure possible and to this district of Idaho. The community is entitled to hearty congratulations.

NEWS TRAVELS FAST

When you stop to think about it, the real marvel in connection with Byrd's flight over the South Pole isn't the fact that he made the flight so much as the fact that the whole world knew about it the next day. The speed with which modern communication is carried on is an amazing thing. A couple of decades ago Peary went to the North Pole; but it was months before anyone knew anything about it. Now news travels more swiftly than anything else on earth.

The greatest battle of the war of 1812—Jackson's fight at New Orleans—was fought after peace had actually been signed. It took a month to get the news across the Atlantic. What a contrast with today, where a trip to the South Pole is known all over the world less than 24 hours after it happens!

THE NEITHER STAIRS, NOR GROWS FAT

Better times are in store for the farmer, but he is still far from being in a satisfactory financial condition, says Arthur M. Hyde, secretary of agriculture, in his annual report.

Hyde asserts that while farm incomes average higher for the last year than in several previous years, and the trend of population from the farm to the city is declining, the purchasing power of the farmer has not improved proportionately. An encouraging factor is the gradual recovery of farm values in all parts of the nation. But the season of 1929 saw more improvement in the gross income of farmers and in the price situation than it did in the net income of farmers, because of increased costs, including higher taxes.

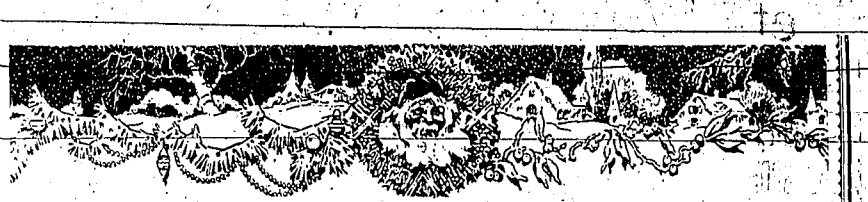
The secretary finds that the farmer's friends this year were cattle, hogs and chickens, rather than grains, fruits and vegetables. Farmers' productive livestock were in much better condition than those confining their output to soil crops. Increased prices offset any reduction in volume of cattle, hogs or sheep sales. Present indications are that the income from livestock for the coming years may be no greater than it was during 1929.

The dairy industry is found to be stable, since annual consumption seems to remain about 1 per cent ahead of production. The report states that dairymen should continue as one of the most satisfactory branches of agriculture.

Crop production for the last season was disappointing in practically all lines, with corresponding compensation in higher prices, excepting cotton, which, in spite of a rather small crop, did not meet the price levels of the two previous seasons. And if America is to hold its supremacy in world markets as a result of its present crop, more thought must be given to raising quality crops, the secretary warns.

Mr. Hyde's conclusions on land utilization appear to be sound. He lays much of the economic hardships which afflict the farming industry to mismanagement and unwarranted expansion of acreage and the planting of marginal lands. He charges over-zealousness of land-owning interests and selling agencies with contributing to too rapid expansion.

Land which still can be brought under the plow are mostly the marginal field and their use will not be warranted until population and consumption of farm products justify it.
