GRATEFUL, EVEN THOUGH WE HAD NOT BEEN SO SOLICITOUS ABOUT RAIN AS THE PACIFIC COAST. We have snow, and for a few hours the Christmas season had just touched enough to convince some of us that Christmas is actually almost upon us.

WE WOULD WISH THE WEATHER MAN TO FORGET THAT WE BECAME NETTLED AND MOST IRRITATED LAST WINTER WHEN HE SHOWED US WITH SNOW AND PILED IT UP DRIFTS AND KEPT THE THERMOMETER DOWN UNDER STEEL LEASH. Bygones should be bygones! But we do need snow and cold weather, in reasonable moderation, of course—that should be understood—for this winter. We are happy that the weather man has demonstrated his ability to start snow, and we should like more of it, not only to make Christmas more real but to add to our supply of irrigation water as well.

THE SIGNS ARE UP
 THE signs forbidding left hand turns at the intersection of Main and Shoshone streets have been in place for several days, but it would appear to innocent pedestrians that obedience to the law will come only when the police adopt a hard boiled attitude. Left turns are still being made.

 A NEW TARIFF THEORY DEMANDED
 IDAHO FREE PRESS

JOSEPH R. GRUNDY IS NOW A FULL FLEDGED SENATOR OF THE UNITED STATES FROM THE STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA. His appointment by the governor of that state has been confirmed by the senate.

IT IS HIS IMPROVEMENT ON WHAT VARE WOULD HAVE BEEN. Vare was "hauled at the door" and excluded from the senate because he was accused of having spent \$750,000 to secure his own election and that of his party ticket in a state campaign.

GRUNDY, BY HIS CONCENTRATION OR HOAST—HAS SPENT \$200,000 OF HIS OWN MONEY—IN THE PRESENT CAMPAIGN TO SEE THAT TARIFF RATES SHOULD BE ENACTED TO SUIT THE INTERESTS OF EASTERN MANUFACTURERS. It is said that 22 out of 47 states assumed, following Pennsylvania manufacturers were increased in the pending tariff bill—that these increased rates would give to Pennsylvania alone, annually, \$1,200,000,000. Aside from this, Mr. Grundy also asserts he was instrumental in the presidential campaign in raising \$200,000 largely from Pennsylvania manufacturers, for the campaign purposes.

FOR THE LAST 30 OR 40 YEARS MR. GRUNDY HAS INTERESTED HIMSELF IN LOBBYING FOR HIGHER TARIFF RATES ON MANUFACTURES OF OUR NATIONAL CAPITAL. So persistent have been his activities in this direction that "Grundynism" has become a synonym for high tariff propaganda in official national circles.

YET WE ARE OF THE OPINION THAT THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. GRUNDY TO THE UNITED STATES SENATE WILL WORK AN ULTIMATE GOOD. Have you never read "When the Gods would destroy they first make mad." This we hope will prove to be the case with Grundy, behind the election of Vare and the appointment of Grundy to the senate.

FOR 100 YEARS WE HAVE HAD A TARIFF FOR THE SAKE OF PROTECTING MANUFACTURES. This tariff system was inaugurated on the plea that in this country manufactures was an "infant industry." It has been perpetuated and rates increased on the theory that if manufactures was protected other business prosperity would be assured. 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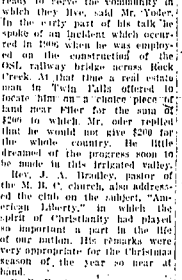

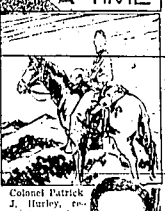

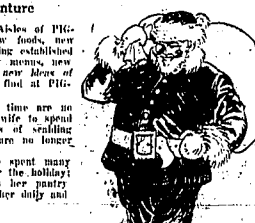
