OUR JOBS CUT OUT FOR US

The fact that the Union Pacific has indicated that it will test in the courts the right of the interstate commerce commission to force it to build the Crane-Crescent Lake link of railroad gives us in this district of Idaho our cue as to procedure in securing the extension of the Minidoka-Buhl branch westward.
 We face the necessity of fighting for it.
 In these columns today is reprinted an editorial from the Oregon Journal in which that newspaper gives consideration to some of the activities of the Union-Pacific-in-our-neighboring-state. We of this part of Idaho are only nominally interested in the Crane-Crescent Lake cutoff, but the editorial from the Portland newspaper as to the things the Union Pacific has done—and things it has NOT done—could be written to apply to this part of Idaho by merely changing names and dates.

The Journal's pronouncements are sane, studied and balanced. It is not engaged in any baiting of a railroad. What it is doing is to stand up for what it considers the best interests of Central Oregon and Western Idaho. The Portland Oregonian, wealthy, powerful and conservative, usually slow in lending its influence to any campaign smacking of a crusade, has also been bluntly outspoken in its appraisal of the reticence of the Union Pacific to expand its lines for the benefit of Oregon.

Shall we in Idaho sit idly by and permit Oregon to proceed with a struggle to secure railroad expansion without entering the ring on our own account? Is Oregon's need for improved transportation any more pronounced than Idaho's? Are we less capable of taking our own part than Oregon?

The movement to secure our railroad extension has already been launched by joint action of the chambers of commerce of Buhl and Twin Falls. A special committee is laboring now on some of the preliminary work necessary to be done before the campaign really comes into full swing. One of the things needed to supplement the work of organizations and their committees is the enthusiastic and whole hearted support of all the public.

Where does the Grange stand on this deeply vital subject of a railroad extension and lower freight rates? The interests of its members and of all producers, whether members of the Grange or any other similar organization, are irrevocably tied up in transportation costs. But producers need to act in their own behalf in this movement to secure for this part of Idaho the facilities they need in railroad transportation and rates. Too much is at stake for them to let

 Our job is cut out for us in this railroad situation. We must assert ourselves, and go out after our own benefits. "Show me," has always been the motto of the Union Pacific, and it still is. We can either stand up for ourselves or be trampled. That fact is becoming increasingly plain.

NOT DOING ITS PART
 Oregon Journal
 It is perhaps to be expected that the railroads should sometime test the legality of interstate commerce commission orders directing roads to build lines into new territory where the roads wish to build up not. Nevertheless, it is most regrettable that the Union Pacific is going to court on this issue in the case of the Crane-Crescent Lake link.

The Union Pacific railroad has served Oregon for a long time in some particular. It has, in fact, been a very excellent treatment from this state. It has enjoyed a large part of the freight and passenger business of Oregon. It expects to continue to carry a good portion of Oregon's transportation business. Yet what is the Union Pacific doing to help increase the business in Oregon?

Oregon asked a long time ago for a line into Central Oregon down the Deschutes. The Union Pacific has been in the territory and help build it. When the Hill road wanted to go in, the Union Pacific tried to block those plans. Failing in that, it then built a parallel line, resulting in a waste of millions.

Although the Union Pacific train roll down the Columbia gorge route at a cost far less than any railroad could operate any train over the Cascade to Seattle, the Union Pacific has steadfastly fought reduced freight rates—rates that should increase the volume of freight through the Columbia gorge to Portland and Oregon. In fact, at the hearing held under the direction of the High Smith resolution, Union Pacific officials testified that they should increase the volume of haul, the rates from the interior to Puget Sound and to Portland should be equalized, which, in effect, would undoubtedly increase the volume of freight through the Columbia gorge.

Portland long asked for a faster schedule between Chicago and this city over the Union Pacific. This region asked for schedules approximating those between the Midwest and California cities. They were never granted until the Great Northern took over the schedule. Not until then did Oregon get a shorter schedule to the East.

And now, comes the request for a cross state line in Oregon, line that its expense justified would produce traffic to pay for the service, and the fact that the interstate commerce commission has not ordered built. And what is the attitude of the Union Pacific? It will fight the order in the courts. The people of Oregon are glad that the Union Pacific has been in the territory and help build it. But what is the road doing to help build the state and build business here? What is it doing to increase production and therefore transportation? What is it doing to help create business for Oregonians and for the Union Pacific?
 Unfortunately, it is going to court to keep from building a road that would develop traffic which the Union Pacific itself would serve.

SOVIET ADVANCES GIGANTIC PLAN TO DOUBLE NATIONAL INCOME AND REBUILD THE COUNTRY

Editor's note: The author of this article is a member of the editorial staff of the AVANTI (Alban) Daily Herald, who has returned from a tour of Russia.

 A plan similar with the leaders of Soviet Russia hope to bring about the greatest economic and social development in history ever made in five years is the principal topic of conversation with the students in this article. It is called the "Five-Year Plan," and in this article I am recording, as a matter of fact, the most important points of the plan, which even to Americans may seem a gigantic and fantastic dream.

The communists hope to rebuild the nation completely from industrial and agricultural production to dramatic and art. It is to be pointed to an evidence that the Soviet is expanding so much faster in internal rebuilding that it cannot be bothered with trying to reorganize other people and nations. It is in fact a program of government; it is offered as a hero to the millions—non-Communists—of the world.

The communists hope to rebuild the nation completely from industrial and agricultural production to dramatic and art. It is to be pointed to an evidence that the Soviet is expanding so much faster in internal rebuilding that it cannot be bothered with trying to reorganize other people and nations. It is in fact a program of government; it is offered as a hero to the millions—non-Communists—of the world.

The "Second Revolution" is the term by which the plan is sometimes known. As the first revolution was destructive, so the "Five-Year Plan" is to be constructive. The Soviet people better believe more and better textile plants, a great rebuilding of housing facilities, and a new development of communications. You are told that in five years Russia's exportations will be increased to the point of only by those of America, and that instead of under-production the nation will be able to produce what will be available for export.

Popular Education
 The plan also includes a general education of the people—particularly the workers—of the world. It is to be carried out in Russia; the re-educating of Russia's great body of illiterate people will be a major objective of the plan.

United States President Establishes Precedent by Calling on the President-Elect.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 27, (UP)—President-elect Calvin Coolidge, Mexico, was received here Thursday with the outward symbols of renewed friendship between two sister republics.

The Mexican statesman was met by Secretary of State and Mrs. Stimson upon his arrival from Baltimore at noon. Troops and the army band rendered military honors to the distinguished guest, elaborate preparations for entertainment of President-elect Coolidge and his wife were in progress during the past two years.

Remain Until Sunday. The president-elect, Simon Ortiz Rubio and his party will remain until Sunday.

With unprecedented honors, the United States government met here Thursday for the first three days as an outward symbol of good-will and an indication of American confidence in present Mexican regime.

President Hoover broke with tradition late Thursday by making a personal call upon the Mexican statesman at the embassy here. No other president-elect has been so honored by an American president. This attention hitherto has been reserved for actual heads of governments.
