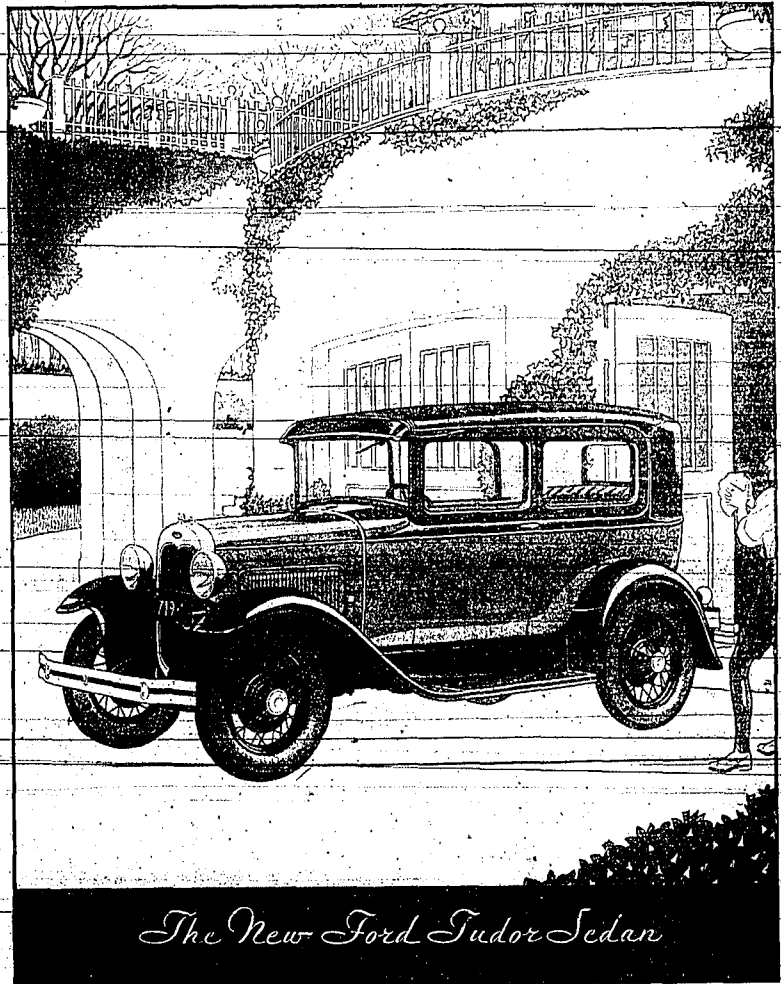

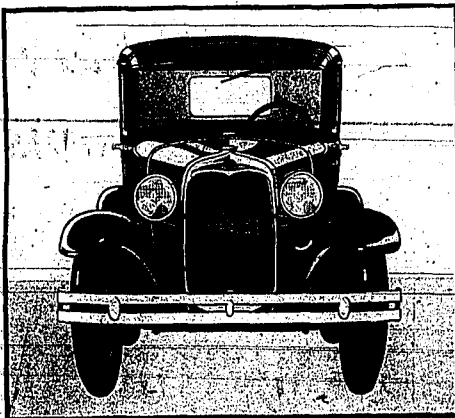

WASHINGTON, (UP)—Submarines may be the decisive factor in determining whether the impending London naval conference will be a success or a failure.
