SPLENDOR MARKS ROYAL WEDDINGS IN CITY OF ROME

Princess Marie Jose of Belgium Today Becomes Bride of Italian Prince, Humbert

ROME, Jan. 8 (UP)—The royal marriages of Italy and Belgium were united today with Prince Marie Jose of Belgium and Crown Prince Humbert of Italy were married in the Pauline chapel of the royal quiral palace.

It was a genuine love match in the eyes of the people, such as it has not been seen in Europe since before the war, when Prince Marie Jose, daughter of King Leopold of Belgium, was betrothed to the crown prince of Italy.

Kings and queens and princes gathered in Pauline chapel in historic associations, for the wedding in which Marie Jose abandoned her Belgian and assumed the dignity of queen of Italy.

Outside the city was a riot of joy, the royal cortege passed through the formal rooms of the palace to the chapel, where the king, Albert of the Belgians, King Albert of Italy and King Victor Emmanuel accompanied Queen Elizabeth of Belgium.

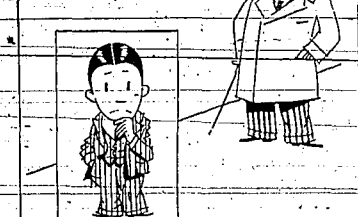
WESTERN STATES
DECLARED SOURCE
OF MUCH ALCOHOL

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8, (UPI)—Western farm states, spokesmen of which have started a new prohibition fight in the senate to attack an enforcement bill, are the largest source of illicit liquor, federal prohibition authorities here believe.

Corn fields of Idaho, Nebraska, and other western and midwestern states, which have long been prolifically dry, are held to constitute the source of the raw product used in manufacture of thousands of gallons of alcohol sold by bootleggers.

Industrial alcohol manufacturers, which western retailers have declared is being tapped by bootleggers for large supplies of alcohol.

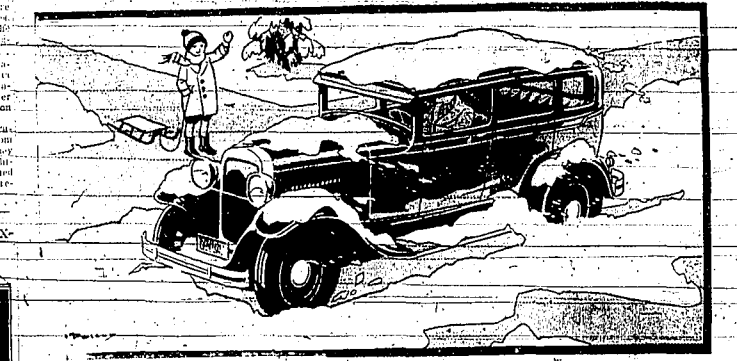
