STIMSON SAYS U. S. WILLING TO SLASH NAVY

American Stands Ready for Reduction if Agreement is Reached

POWERS BOUNDING EACH OTHER OUT

French Newspaper Declares Important Progress Not Yet Made

LONDON, Jan. 23 (UP)—The United States navy could be reduced, Secretary of State Henry Stimson told the House naval conference today.

National representatives are in relative bitterness at the Stimson-Britain talks, and therefore, if the conference finds a basis for agreement, the American strength could be cut.

No Reduction Made

The American secretary of state in his speech to the delegates gathered at St. James palace said he had decided not to make a statement of the naval negotiations of the country, which the United States is conducting with Great Britain.

The official version of the conference was given to a general explanation by the chief delegates of the two powers, representing the lives, powers, reputation of the delegates, however, exposed their "disagreements" and that the conference was not a success.

Stimson said that the conference was a failure, and that the United States was not willing to make any reduction in its navy.

PARIS, Jan. 23 (UP)—French newspapers commented today upon what they termed the hesitation of each of the five powers engaged in the London naval conference to show its hand.

After four days' talks with an exchange of views, the Parisian believes it would be an error to conclude that any progress has been made.

"The parties," he says, "are still in a period of silence, and are negotiating and awaiting each other."

Stimson observers believe, as the chief of the first speech in the conference, that the theory of limitation of armaments has been introduced for the first time in the conference is to be successful.

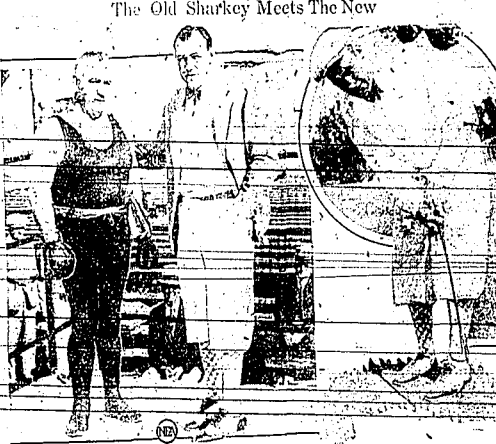
