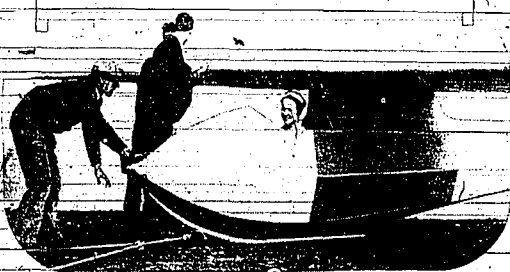

PUSH THIS ALONG

An informal report made to the board of directors of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce Monday evening on the work so far done on the campaign to secure extension west of the Minidoka-Buhl branch railroad was interpreted by the board as marking a real interest in the proposal outside of communities of Buhl and Twin Falls.

That is to be expected. The facilities of this district are limited to one system, and our western outlet by way of Minidoka and thence west a distance of more than 100 miles farther to much of the volume originating on the Twin Falls tract than it would be if the Buhl branch were extended to connect with the main line.

It is natural that this district should want an extension of the branch line. Not to want it would mark the district as lacking interest in one of its most vital needs. Why be 700 miles from tidewater when by a comparatively inexpensive piece of construction we could be only 600 miles from tidewater.

It is encouraging to be informed that Buhl and Twin Falls are to have the co-operation of other communities in the campaign to secure this rail road extension. The campaign should be continued with renewed vigor. We may rest assured that we shall get out of the bottom neck only by our own efforts. Neither the Union Pacific nor a government will release us. The results we are to secure will depend on our own efforts.

GREAT MAN RETIRES

NEWS of the resignation of William Howard Taft as chief justice of the United States supreme court, announced Monday by United Press, brings regrets to a vast number of Americans. The retirement of this distinguished citizen by reason of a breakdown in health is melancholy proof of the fact that even the most favored can not withstand the ravages of time indefinitely. The two men later brought up the subject again. They wondered if the present gymnasium's provisions for safety are in accord with state law. Their conjectures were not idle. The present gymnasium offers real fire hazards when it comes to the handling of capacity crowds. The fact that no tragedy has ever been enacted there is an indication of good fortune and not a guarantee of safety. The proposed new gymnasium is so planned that nine exits are to be provided.

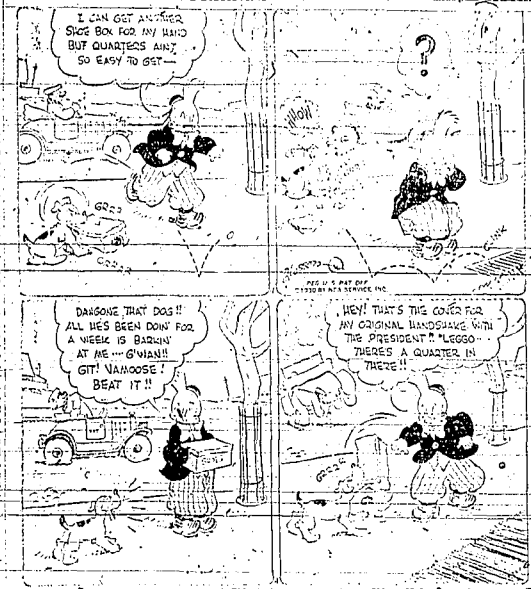
