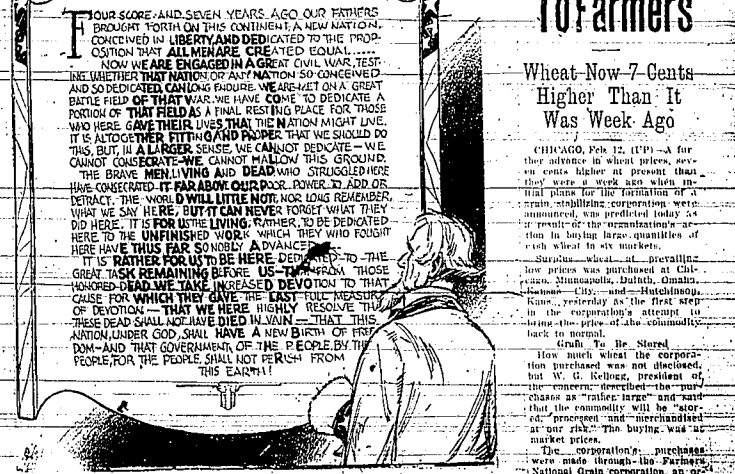

scrub bulls will produce daughters which will on the law of averages produce less than their dams. In other words, use of scrub or inferior bulls is the surest method known to kill the dairy business. Twin Falls county has too many scrub bulls.

### 134 VOTES TO SPARE

IN the bond election last Friday the affirmative vote was sufficient to adopt the issue with 134 to spare. The "majority" of votes may have been 45. The no votes were 507. On the basis of the no vote cast, 507 affirmative vote had to be twice that, or 1014, to secure adoption. The affirmative vote was 1148, or 134 more than was required. In other words, 134 affirmative voters might have remained at home on the basis of the negative vote cast, and the results of the election would have been the same.

Suppose the total vote cast in such an election had been 3300, 3000 for and 300 against. Two-thirds of the total vote cast would have been 2200 votes, and the "majority" would have been 1100 votes.

The affirmative would still have had 2100 votes to spare on the basis of the number of negative votes cast. The bond issue was authorized! It's "majority" was 45. The affirmative votes were 134 more than required by law for adoption.

### Best Editorial of the Day

#### RELIGION AND THE IMPERIAL

George Washington, in his farewell address, said that religion and morality were the indispensable supports of the republic. The orthodox Wall Whittam wrote: "The great and permanent grandeur of these states must be religion."

The civilization we established, our government was founded, by men of a religious cast of mind. If they were not all personally believers, their mode of thought had been fashioned in a religious atmosphere. A church was the first structure erected by the colonists, both at Plymouth and Jamestown. It was an earnest religion at Plymouth, a light-hearted religion at Jamestown, but religion was the most important ethical influence in both these centers of American civilization, and in the Maryland of Lord Baltimore and Charles Carroll of Carrollton.

No form of ethics other than taught from the pulpit and at the bedside by religious fathers and mothers, has any serious hold on the American people. And in the dream of religious influence we may find much of the explanation of the lowering of moralities and consequent growth of vice and crime in this country.

Religion has been pretty much dropped out of the scheme of things in America. The family prayer that used to be on the day's program in most American homes would be regarded as a curiosity today. The discipline maintained in the churches of a half century ago would today be inconceivable. People do not much talk about this about religion.

Yet what subject could be more important to thoughtful men than destiny? There can be no intelligent philosophy which leaves out consideration of the thought of its creator. Scientists may yet be able to prove that men select their lives, numbers, or even from out of matter, but that what can grasp the idea of anything starting without some superior force to start it?

And what man knowing the human spirit, can believe that men are an insignificant, accidental, throw-up together and allowed to disolve without meaning or purpose? Who can fail to recognize the spark of Divinity in man himself? Who can believe that the flame of life is a mere product of physical combination which can be snuffed out like a lamp? Who can contemplate the command man has attained over physical objects, and the victories of the human spirit over self and space and matter, and still believe that men have only the destiny of weeds and stones?

Reverence for God and worship of God therefore becomes the natural act of every normal human being, and the discovery of His laws and His plans for life and destiny is the duty of every thoughtful man and woman.

The religious institutions now existing represent the effort of our fathers to glorify and apply Divine will, large enough it is to pick flows in, then to guard with their doctrines and the practices, but they represent more thought applied to this first of problems than most of us have ever given to it.

It sometimes occurs that the churches themselves do not fully appreciate the prime importance of their mission. They are the natural nurseries of character, the expounders of underlying truth so vital that the discussion of fine points of doctrine within them seems trivial.

In Twin Falls county the number of scrub bulls in service is greater by far than it should be. Scrub bulls put the dairy man out of business by deteriorating the producing capacity of dairy progeny. On the other hand quality bulls sire daughters which will often show increased production over their dams if the dams are not too outstandingly high producers.

One of the most effective means of making good dairy sires available to the small dairy owner without making the cost of production prohibitive is to organize bull associations. The usual plan is to have five blocks, or small groups of dairy men, in one association, and to buy a bull for each block. The bulls are rotated at the end of each second year to prevent inbreeding. This plan puts a lot of scrub bulls out of commission, and the investment per cow under the bull association plan of procedure is usually lower than where individual ownership of cheap bulls is followed. A fewer number of bulls has to be fed and cared for, and the herd owners secure the use of animals of good breeding.

Another big advantage of the bull association plan is that the animals are kept long enough to ascertain their true worth. This makes it possible to prove sires and to preserve the outstanding ones. Under the usual plan where sires are purchased and used by one breeder, a bull of outstanding merit is too often sold and butchered about the time his former owner finds from the records of his daughters that the bull was highly valuable.

In the state of Idaho, according to the monthly letter of the dairy herd improvement association for December, 1929, issued by the University there were just 87 bulls on record which had been proved by means of comparative checks of production of dams and daughters. Some of those bulls were butchered before their records were known.

The results of studies of 3,700 Idaho cows in dairy herd improvement associations show that cows producing 200 pounds of fat were twice as profitable, returned twice as much profit over feed costs, as 150 pound cows. The same studies showed that one 400 pound cow equaled five 150 pound cows, and that one 500 pound fat cow equaled seven 150 pound cows.

The number of dairy cattle in a given district is of less importance than the producing capacity of the cows. Cows of fairly good production, 200 or 250 pounds of fat, if bred

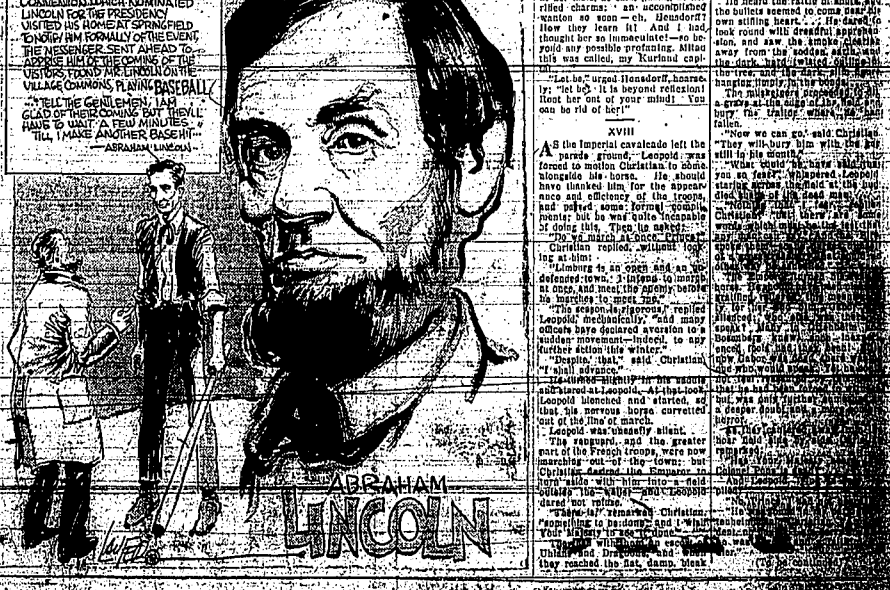
