BYRD EXPEDITION

LATEST CHICAGO CRIME AROUSES IRE OF CITIZENS

Mrs. Agnes Lavender Found Slain Near Forest Glen; Two Others Are Attacked by Fiend; Dragnet Is Spread

CHICAGO, Feb. 19. (UP)—The murder of a comatose wife who missed a train at an outlying station held the focus of interest today in Chicago's struggle to rid itself of crime.

Two other women were attacked and there were two shootings as police rounded up another 500 suspicious persons from the streets, but the mystery and horror of the murder of Mrs. Agnes Lavender, 35, the mother of a 2-year-old daughter, near lonely Forest Glen station of the Chicago, Milwaukee and Pacific railroad, was the talk of the hour.

"Cat Hand" Suspected
A soft-spoken little man with spectacles, once arrested as the suspected "Cat Hand" who had attacked and robbed several women, was held as a suspect although police were almost convinced of his innocence.

The latest clue, involving a tall rallow man in a torn blue overcoat with a scar across his face, was followed vigorously by police in Chicago and all suburbs and nearby cities and towns.

The clue was furnished by Harry S. Abitz, agent at the Northwestern railroad station at Jefferson Park, a mile from the spot where Mrs. Lavender's body was found yesterday in a weed-grown ditch.

In a Hurry
"I've got to get out of here right away," when the train's blue coat asked him, Abitz said. "When told there would not be a train for an hour and was advised to catch a Milwaukee road train, the man answered: 'No I can't sit over there—I can't wait.'"

That was last night Mrs. Lavender apparently missed her train Monday night and was forced from the station platform to a lonely spot on the right-of-way, struck in the face and shot to death. Foot-prints that led to the forest preserve adjoining indicated the murderer was a small man.

Well-Organized and Properly-Functioning Co-operative Association Urged by President Vincent of Moscow, Idaho

BOISE, Feb. 19. (UP)—Salvation of the grower of agricultural products depends upon a well-organized and properly functioning cooperative association, declared Dr. G. C. Vincent, Moscow, president of the Idaho State Horticultural association, in his address before the thirty-fifth annual meeting of the association which opened here Tuesday.

Both efficient production methods and efficient marketing are necessary to put the fruit industry on a successful basis, Dr. Vincent explained. Disregard of the marketing angle in the past has resulted in unsatisfactory prices and almost constant complaint, the speaker pointed out.

Recognition of the value of quality products, of the value of advertising and insistency upon wider distribution will guarantee continued prosperity of the fruit industry, Vincent stated. "Last year was one of the most successful and prosperous years in the history of the Idaho fruit industry," Vincent said. This is partly due, he believes, to the growing tendency on the part of the growers to meet and exchange ideas and profit by each other's experience.

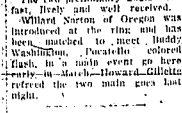

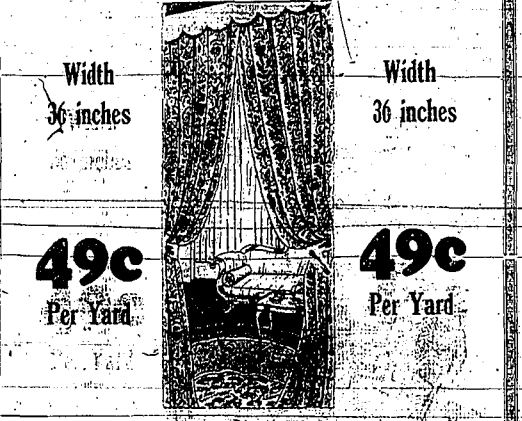

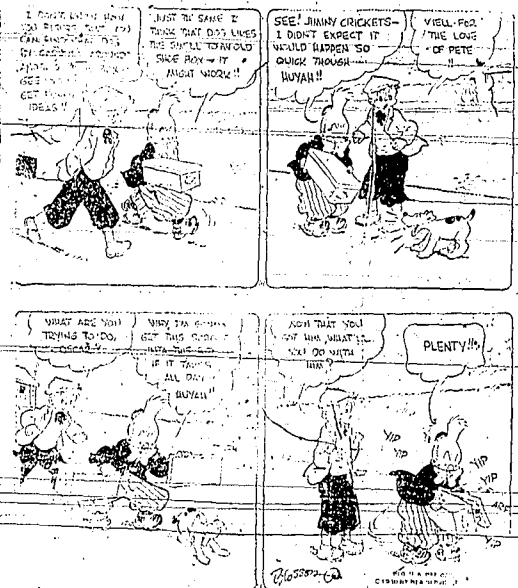

The approaching session of the Idaho state legislature which is to be convened for the discussion and enactment of a road and highway program for the present year is pregnant with possibilities.

It is possible, though hardly probable, that the session will go along smoothly without fight or friction.

It has been stated a successful effort has been made to forestall the action of the legislature in the present highway matter and how the present highway matter can be better the members of the session it is easy to see there is room for plenty of heat to be raised, and there will be in that event.

One or two things will have to be adopted. Either the allocation of the funds to be provided shall be so fair that all will be reasonably satisfied or the funds put into an pot and let communities take their chance later.

If the suggestion made at the Pugetello meeting last week by the State Chamber of Commerce is carried through the provision of a non-political committee to sit in and advise with the state highway department on the division of the funds and the location of the roads, a good deal of the time can be saved with more general satisfaction.

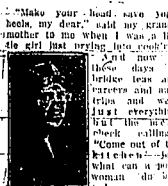
Chantemps Urged As French Head

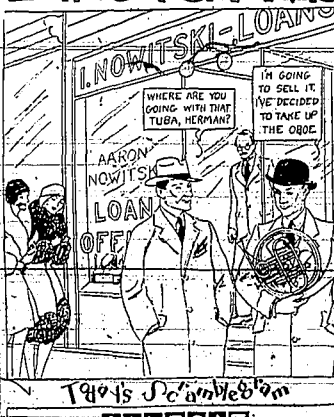

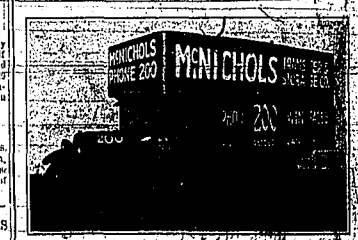
