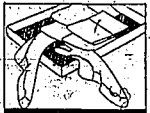

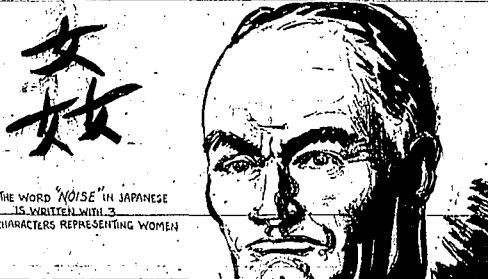

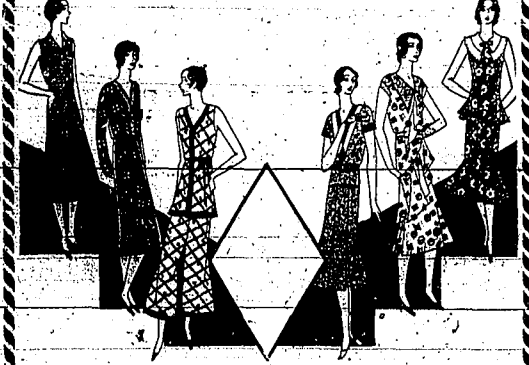

# Nine Persons Lose Lives as Fire Levels Indian School

## STORY OF HEROIC RESCUE ATTEMPT BECOMES KNOWN

WINNEMAN, Wash., Feb. 26 (UP)—A heroic story of how two Catholic sisters battled flames in vain to save their school property Tuesday night after a major fire had driven six miles across country to destroy the school property was told to the reporter at the altar at Cross lake.

Sister Superior Margaret and Sister Joseph, Indian pupils at the Cross lake Indian school in northern Idaho, were burned to death Tuesday night when a major fire broke for space in a hall from a second story window.

Word of the fire was received at the Post Office here Tuesday night. The fire, which broke at 10:30 p. m. at Winneman, the nearest railway station, from the story was told by a woman here.

Miss Superior Charles had to walk back to the place from Cross lake to bring back Sister Joseph, who was suffering at the time. The injured sister will receive medical treatment at the Post Office here.

When the details of the origin of the fire were lacking it was presumed to have started on the stairs from the school. The Indian girls were quartered in the West part of the main building.

The Sister Superior filed in an attempt to lead some of the children out of the burning building, but she was overcome by the flames. The bodies of the Sister Superior and her eight pupils will be buried here Tuesday night.
