STOCKS OF WHEAT ELECTORS ASKED ON FARMS SMALL FOR SCHOOL LEVY

Government Figures Show That There Is Less Wheat on March 1 Than At Any Time Since the Year of 1923

WASHINGTON, March 11. (UP)—The stocks of wheat on farms in the United States on March 1, 1930, were the smallest for that date since 1923, according to figures released by the department of agriculture.

The percentage of previous crop which is being sold out of the country was estimated for corn at 16.3 per cent, for wheat at 15.9 per cent, and for soybeans at 15.9 per cent. The department pointed out that the estimate included wheat which is being sold for export, including from 23,000,000 to 27,000,000 bushels, which probably will be sold for export during the year.

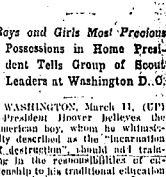

Luck of Draw Forces Locals To Meet Whirlwinds from Northern Part of State in the Tournament of Pocatello

The Twin Falls Indians, winners of the basketball title in the South Central Idaho district, will probably leave Thursday morning for Pocatello where they will enter the annual Idaho state interscholastic basketball tournament and fight for the right to go to the national tournament at Chicago.

There will be seven district champions and Pocatello, the host team in the competition which is held here, the gymnasium of the southern branch of the University of Idaho. The first game will be at 7:30 p. m. on Thursday March 13, and the play will continue till Saturday night.

The "state" basketball tournament plan is being followed, the losers going into a consolation tournament for third and fourth places.

The teams entered are district champions are Idaho, Ariz., Montpelier, Coeur d'Alene, Moscow, Twin Falls, and Madison high of Nebraska. Pocatello will be the eighth team.

The drawings for the first day throw Twin Falls against Coeur d'Alene, the strongest team in north Idaho, in the first game of the tournament. The second game at 9:30 will be between Moscow and Idaho. Thursday evening at 7 o'clock Montpelier will play Pocatello and at 8 o'clock Pocatello will play Ariz. Winners meet losers and losers meet losers on Friday.

In meeting Coeur d'Alene the Twin Falls team will meet the 1928 state champions and the runner-up in the 1929 tournament. None of the teams have shown great skill in pre-tournament play yet all have reputations for steadiness and regulation. If the Bruins are successful, in downing the strong north Idaho team in the first game the chances are that they will have a good chance to win the state title.

There will be several hundred fans from Twin Falls on campus for the game.

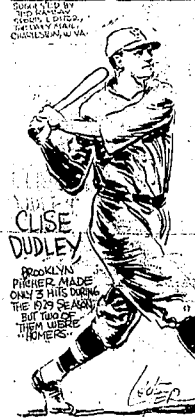
UTAH AGGIES ARE CASABA CHAMPS

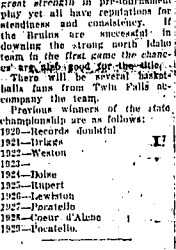

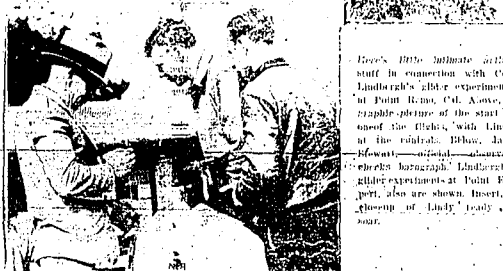

MILK ORDINANCE

(Continued from Page One)
must be a seal and clean milk can, well screened, where the milk is prepared for delivery. All utensils and other machinery cleaned and sterilized by steam or water or chlorine solution. It was also a practicable arrangement for the cows the milk must be kept below that temperature until after delivery. The delivery containers, according to the ordinance's provisions, must have all clear glass bottles sealed with light caps or covers. All cows must be absolutely free from disease and in good health. Diseased cows must be segregated from the rest of the herd until tests prove a full recovery of health. In the event of failure to comply with the ordinance those selling milk may be suspended from further selling in the city. A hearing on the suspension may be held before the city council. The council may also cancel the registration. The ordinance also provides rules for the taking of the milk samples for testing and that any registered milk dealer, following a report of a test made, may demand a refund, such to be made within six days.
