Reduce Wheat Acreage and
Have Larger Farm Income
Federal Board Recommends

WASHINGTON, March 18.—(UPI)—Reduce cotton and wheat acreage, plant a home garden, and have a larger farm income is the advice the agricultural department and federal farm board is broadcasting to farmers. "The south can never be

permanently prosperous until it adopts the soil saving program," J. A. Evans of the agricultural department said today.

"Why raise five bushels of wheat when you can get more money for four bushels?" Legge of the farm board said.

For the wheat area Legge suggests land be put in flax, which is impeded in great quantity, or be left to pasture to it will be fertile for later use.

"When arrears should be reduced 10 per cent, at least," Legge said. "The present 400,000,000 acreage should be reduced from 400,000,000 to 40,000,000. These figures are estimates."

Legge said one of the greatest wheat problems confronting the board was storage. He said federal agents were studying methods for storing wheat which had been harvested about the middle of June.

"We must have more correct facilities," Legge said. "We should build more storage barns they would find it cheaper than storing at terminals and they get a better price."

Legge indicated the board's wheat holdings were becoming so large that "it might be essential later to sell excesses abroad to create a market for the product."

**Disability Claims
Should Be Filed by
Vets of World War**

In the service or continued in service to file application for disability benefits—do not do so at the office of the disability agency.

The application can be secured from any service center or agency of the American Red Cross, or from local executive secretary of the American Red Cross, or through application at the local office of the Veterans' Bureau.

All veterans who have filed claims with the Bureau which have been disclosed must file again before this date to show that they were not entitled to benefits under a provision contained in the World War Veterans' Act, application for disability compensation.

Every ex-service man who has not previously filed a claim or a claim for disability should take immediate steps to do so before the U. S. Veterans' Bureau.

G. H. Hudelson, manager of the Veterans' Bureau here, said:

Under a provision contained in the World War Veterans' Act, application for disability compensation will be denied if the man has been honorably discharged from the white-field dates of the service during the war.
