

## BODY OF YOUNG WOMAN FOUND

SHIRKES, Cal., March 25 (UPI)—

A blonde girl murder mystery was engrossing the attention of police here and in Los Angeles, California, Sunday. The authorities tried to determine the identity of a girl found dead in the redwood region of the state, hundred miles from San Francisco.

The young woman, a pretty blonde of about 25 years, had been dead for about six weeks, according to Coroner Oscar Swanson and his deputy Sheriff Charles Cavanaugh.

A coroner gave her right eye was believed to have been caused by a bullet wound, but the bullet did not reach the brain, death authorities said.

The girl's body was exquisitely clad and wrapped in a fine fur coat. It was being held in a refrigerated truck en route to Sacramento, State Pathology workers Joseph Wilson and James Dawson made the discovery.

### WHAT MEANS THIS?

In a world that is full of talk of change that does not always mean as much as it should, we folks on the Minidoka-Buhl branch line appear to be the recipients of a change which may be revolutionary. According to a news story in this newspaper yesterday, our latest development in rail road transportation has to do with stage breathing fire and nationalism. that veteran of the branch line, our own "Galloping Goose."

For it seems that quietly and without ostentatious clearing of threats or waving of banners on the part of either the railroad or the public, our own "Galloping Goose" has retired from our midst. Whether the retirement is permanent or merely one step in a series of experiments conceived to provide more satisfactory passenger service for the branch line the Evening Times can not say. But is it not of more than passing import that the "Galloping Goose" has lowered its head, folded its wings closely over itself and settled down to a well earned rest? —

Whether the retirement of the "Galloping Goose" came about as a result of pointed criticism directed against it recently by a visitor from California who was almost overcome by the antics of the "Goose" when he rode it as a passenger from Minidoka to Twin Falls we can not say. Certain it is that his criticism became known. A copy of a letter he wrote, the general manager of the O.S.I., was furnished the newspapers and chambers of commerce up and down the branch, and was given wide distribution. Maybe this criticism resulted in the withdrawal of the "Goose" from service. Again, maybe the "Goose" became ill, and had to have a rest.

If the change was made by the Union Pacific system as a result of the criticism of a visitor, such speed in acting on a complaint can be construed as nothing less than that our railroad, the only railroad we have ever had, sometimes thinks of us and knows we are a part of its system by other tokens than the money we pay it.

A capacity thus to remember us, even though its act is no more than the substitution of a "Leaping Lena" for the historic "Galloping Goose" may fairly be construed as reflecting a change of heart and mind on the part of our railroad.
