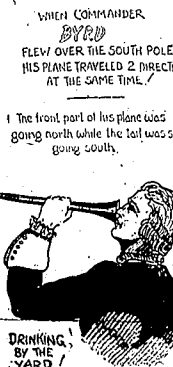
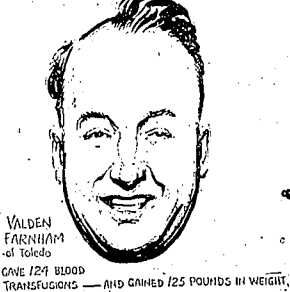
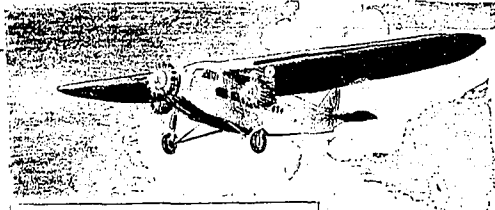

Though Jefferson has been dead for more than 100 years, his ideals of government still inspire leaders of his party. When one considers the tremendous changes that have been wrought in American social, industrial and political life during the last century, the continued dominance of Jefferson's governmental philosophy seems nothing short of amazing.

- What, then, is the secret of the Jefferson leadership?
- The founder of the democratic party held 21 cardinal principles.
- Here they are:
- (1) Republican government and the sovereignty of the people.
 - (2) Opposition to the privileged orders of nobility and the entail system.
 - (3) Universal education and local circulating libraries.
 - (4) Separation of church and state.
 - (5) Freedom of thought and speech.
 - (6) Local self-government.
 - (7) Economy in government and small public debt.
 - (8) A policy of peace.
 - (9) Political equality and universal suffrage.
 - (10) Strict construction of the constitution and sovereignty of the states.
 - (11) Well-trained militia and small standing army.
 - (12) Metallic money, either gold or silver, as a standard.
 - (13) Opposition to bounties and monopolies.
 - (14) Emancipation of slaves.
 - (15) Expansion of the United States to include Louisiana, Florida, Cuba and Canada.
 - (16) Maintenance of Indian reservations.
 - (17) Judiciary beyond the control of the legislative or executive branches of the government.
 - (18) Opposition to nepotism (hiring of officials of close relatives to help administer government).
 - (19) Rotation in office.
 - (20) Opposition to all secession movements, North or South.

This brief summary of Jefferson's policies reveals that many of ideas of the third president of the United States have long since become a part of the government of the country. But when they were first enunciated many of them were considered revolutionary and visionary.

Jefferson was an idealist. He loved humanity. He believed in the universal brotherhood of man. He abhorred all aristocratic tendencies. He believed that all men, poor as well as rich, were entitled to full protection of property and life. He worked for a state that would insure the greatest possible happiness to the greatest possible number. It was in no small part because of his years of unremitting work for the common good that we today enjoy governmental and social privileges that were generally considered impossible less than 200 years ago.

All honor, then, to those who tenaciously cleave to the doctrines enunciated by America's first great commoner. Often they remain steadfast at sacrifice of material gains. The world never provides a path of ease and luxury for those who fight the battles of the common people. Privilege on the other hand seems to offer more to those whose chief aspiration is to get ahead in the world at the expense of his fellow citizens. Complacent, smug, self-satisfied leadership provides soft berths for its own, and is ever ready to transmit a vigorous kick to anyone who would in any way disturb the serene and orderly affairs in which it revolves and has its being, forgetting, meantime, that the privileges it assures were made possible because men of past periods refused to bend the knee and courteously sought to destroy all phases of social life that had a tendency to confer privileges on certain groups and individuals.

Again we say, all honor to those who seek to maintain the principles involved in the political life and philosophy of Jefferson. They are engaged in a worthy cause, and reflect in their natures those qualities which have given to the world its leaders and thinkers and its men of courage.

SCIENTIST SAYS MOON AND EARTH HEAD FOR CRASH

DELAWARE, 4. (UP)—Two great bodies, coming together with a collision—destruction in both is the theoretical prophecy of Dr. Loran T. Stetson, director of Perkins Observatory at Ohio Wesleyan University.

Essentially, however, that is the moon back on a 216,000-mile journey which will end only when the moon and earth meet, each travelling at its usual terrific speed.

The earth's destruction, even if the earth survived, would have a mammoth hardship upon industry and commerce, Dr. Stetson asserted. He said the planet, producing ocean tides, makes possible the water which could not otherwise be utilized in very much the same manner.

CUP OF HOT COFFEE OFTEN CURES 'SICK HEADACHE' SAYS PHYSICIAN

BY DR. MORRIS FISHER
Most congenial to the individual in an analysis of the various remedies used in the treatment of sick headache, Dr. Frederick Fisher emphasizes the importance of disinclining this type of headache from that due to many other causes.
The sick headache attack likely to begin with a feeling of chilliness and of dizziness. The vision seems to become blurred. At such times, Fisher feels that a cup of hot coffee will help to avert the serious developments.
After the sick headache develops the chief effort will be to prevent them, advised by the use of various remedies, most of which are of such strength that it is necessary to have a physician's prescription in order to use them successfully. The physician believes in the use of prolonged use of various castor products, such as acetaminol, aspirin or salicylates. Dr. Fisher knows also the danger associated with the repeated use of morphine and other narcotics to relieve the pain.
Just as important as the treatment of the acute attack is the treatment of the chronic condition between attacks in order to diminish their number or perhaps to prevent them altogether. Dr. Fisher feels that the most important single remedial agency is a careful study of the patient's diet and exercise taken in the form of heat the mixture through and through the cranium. If uncooked material is used and a longer cooking period necessary, it is usually better not to add the crumbly until the food is almost done. This prevents the crumbs from becoming too brown.
The construction of a diet which is so readily adapted to the chief ingredients, vegetable, fish or meat, is mixed with a moderate amount of fat. 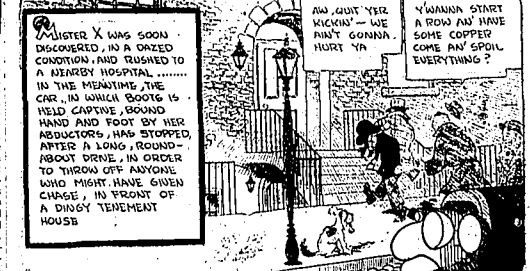

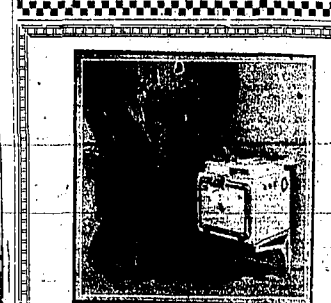
