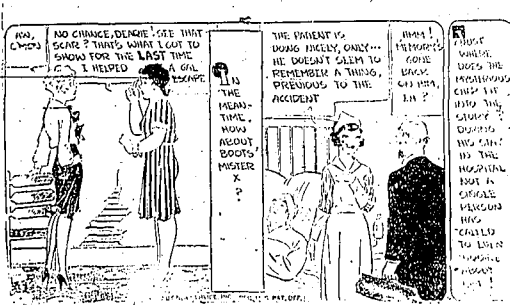
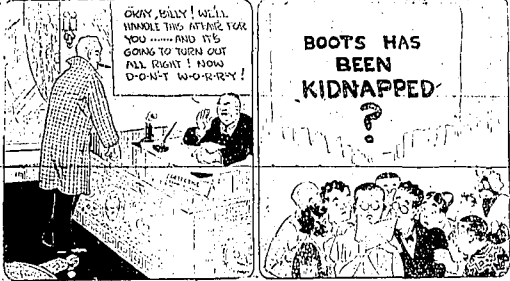

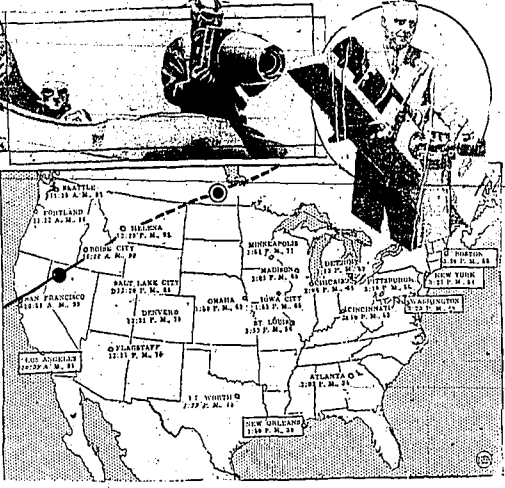

This is bad enough, certainly; but it is like having insult added to injury to find out that pictures showing these bread-lines are being used overseas by communist agitators.

"See! here is what happens to the richest of all capitalist nations! Here is what the workers get in America! This 'land of opportunities' is a land of bread-lines. Its great profits are all for the rich!"

Naturally, no American will like this. It is queer to think that some German steel worker or French textile hand may turn communist because of the United States. It is easy, therefore, to understand why the New York authorities are trying to keep people from taking pictures of these lines.

But that is a rather poor way out of it, after all. The news is bound to get out, and to be used by those who have a theory to advance.

A much better way to foil these red agitators would be to abolish bread-lines. And the only decent way to do that, of course, is to see to it that every man who wants a job can get a job.

That's a large order. But it is the only way in which we can keep "foreign" and "domestic" communists from making use of our troubles for their own ends.

Men and institutions in this world are judged, in the long run, by their failures. The way to prove our social and economic system is as good as any other, it is to take the kinks out of it and make it work the way it is supposed to work.

The full dinner pail will do more to combat communism, here and abroad, than all the policemen's clubs in the world. All of which is just another way of saying that our fight against communism isn't a matter for the police. It's a thing that's up to the leaders of business and industry.

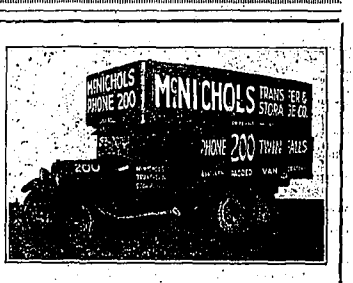
