HOUSE, SENATE IN SHARP FEUD OVER PENSION MEASURE

WASHINGTON, July 2, (UP)—The whole legislative program of congress was dominated by the sharp feud between the House and Senate which threatened to delay the adjournment.

The word was returned pension bill and two other important measures written as the Senate wants them are being kept back to the House with the bill on increased rates.

The pension bill carried the increased compensation rates proposed by the House and the Senate. The House voted 37 to 26 after the bill was passed.

House leaders are in a dilemma—they want to stand by the President and reject the Senate pensionation rates, but there are many who threaten to cast a vote on the Senate bill. This latter course would mean a serious rift in the House with the Senate amendment and send the measure to the White House for a probable veto.

As written by the Senate, the bill would increase the pension of the President from \$100,000 to \$125,000 a year, and the average annual cost for the next five years is estimated conservatively at \$138,900,000.

Considered July 2, the Senate bill was rejected by a vote of 53 to 41. The Senate bill contains the clause allowing a pension of \$100,000 a year, a provision the President vigorously opposed in this week's message.

Instead of granting the allowances from \$12 to \$40 a month, beginning with the expiration of 25 per cent of the salary, the bill provides for \$100,000 a year, and the measure now provides allowances from \$10 to \$30 a month, beginning with the expiration of 25 per cent of the salary.

Secretary Hyde Extols Smoot-Hawley Tariff

WASHINGTON, July 2, (UP)—The enactment of the Smoot-Hawley tariff was praised as a distinct advantage to farmers by Secretary of Agriculture Hyde today in a radio address over the National Broadcasting system.

Hyde, speaking later of a series of talks by high administration officials in a program of tariff education, Hyde attempted to answer the argument that the new tariff increases rates on things the farmer buys more than it does on things he sells.

"The average farmer's income of \$1,163 a year," Hyde said, "now tariff might increase the farmer's budget by four per cent or about \$45 a year."

"He would not," Hyde said, "for out of the 7,000,000 farmers' purchases for commodities produced by agriculture, agriculture produces 40 per cent of the total. In which he is not interested as a producer."

EDITOR PREDICTS 1 HOUR WORKING WEEK WILL COME

With Machines Taking Place of Men—Rapid Rate of Progress in Great Employment Change.

COLUMBIAN, D. C., July 2, (UP)—A one-hour working week in the future was predicted by J. E. Morgan, Washington, editor of the Journal of the National Educational Association, in addressing the association's sixty-fifth annual meeting today.

"Such a prospect is no fantastic dream," Morgan said, pointing out that the present 50-hour week formerly was 48 hours and is steadily declining. With machines and commencing replacing men as a rapid pace, 42 hours a week formerly was 40 hours and now will be shorter still.

Morgan gave figures showing that the average man working 40 hours has one half hour per year, and expressed the opinion the 50-hour week, or the equivalent of the four-hour working day will be in vogue as early as 1950.

The only menace to this prospect, he said, is too much leisure, so much, in fact, he said, that unless early corrective measures are taken, the race will be lost through dissipation and degradation.

"It is a problem that will require the combined efforts of the school home, church and community to meet," Morgan said.

BOXERS TO WEAR FOUL GUARDS IN FUTURE BATTLES

New York Commission Decides That Each Fighter Must Wear Protection Against the Low Blow

NEW YORK, July 2. (AP)—Fights from low blows have been legislated out of existence in boxing contests in New York State as a result of the most drastic action ever taken by a boxing commission.

The New York State Athletic Commission has ruled that each boxer must wear a mouth guard with adequate fibrous protection and continue fighting no matter where he is hit. If a blow lands below the belt and a fighter goes down, he will be counted out exactly as if the punch landed above the belt.

The new rule, passed yesterday by the three commissioners—J. A. Purley, William Muldowney and J. J. Pincus, will go into effect with the Sammy Mandell and Sugar Ray lightweight championship bout at Yankee stadium July 17.

For striking an illegal blow, or a punch below the belt, the penalty under the new rule will be the loss of the round in which it occurred.

It is now up to every boxer to wear a protector which will render a low punch harmless, said Chairman Purley.

The new rule is the outgrowth of tests made by Sammy Mandell and Al Singer wearing a Taylor cup, and both found that the protection was not good.

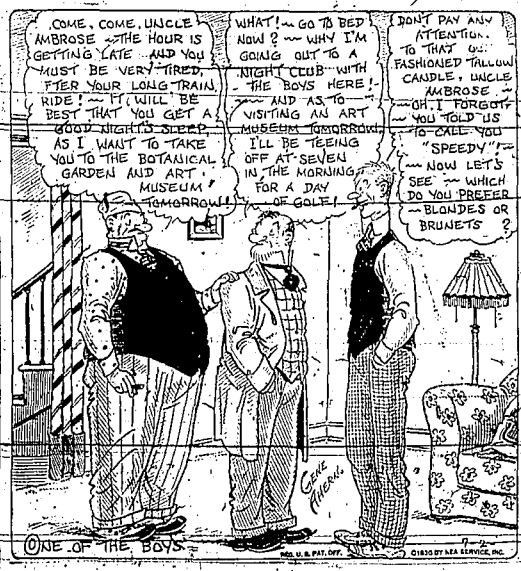

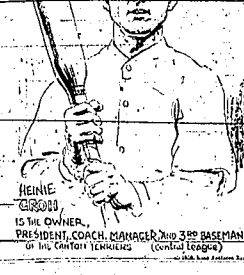
