Ramos, a fisherman by trade, caught a fish in the river La Plata. He was following the custom of biting the fish by biting its head.

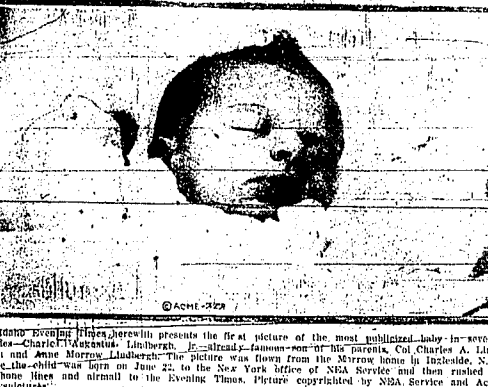

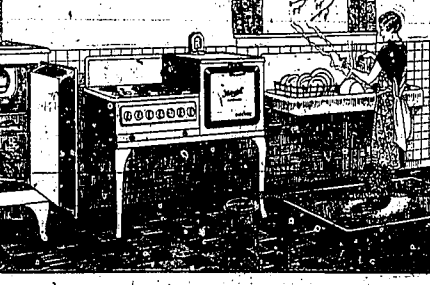
