Sir:—The recent child born of the convention system of our state, which system has been so often denounced by our brilliant senator, William E. Borah, is the law which provides that we American citizens shall elect our legislators and our executives and under our political party affiliations we are to exercise our right of suffrage in the primary election. I hope in the coming election the great senator will not overlook the opportunity of coming to denounce this unjust system, together with its unbecoming state knows that our franchise privileges are being juggled and curtailed by a group of politicians who are willing to sacrifice above principle and the rights of our good people.

Now it seems to be Bobby Jones; and he, too, seems to be just the sort of stuff that the nation needs in a popular figure.

Really, we owe these two young men a good deal. They have given us, especially our youngsters, very worthy targets for hero worship. They have, too, set a pretty high standard for future national idols to live up to.

THE "SAFE AND SOUND" FOURTH

SURVEYING, at a slight distance, the Fourth of July casualties, one is struck with the thought that we have been putting most of the emphasis in the wrong place in our campaign for a safe and sane fourth.

This year the holiday celebration cost more than 200 lives. Of these, 14 were taken by fireworks, 107 by autos and 65 by drownings, with the rest due to miscellaneous reasons.

Our safety campaigns have nearly all hinged on fireworks. Yet fireworks, it appears, are about one-eighth as dangerous as automobiles and about one-fifth as treacherous as plunges at the bathing beach.

The answer can be summed up in one word—carelessness. Long-continued educational work has reduced the fireworks hazard to a minimum, but the motorist and the bather still fail to take the proper precautions. Until they do, the Fourth of July will remain as the deadliest holiday on our calendar.
