TROOPS MAINTAIN CONSTANT WATCH OVER ALEXANDRIA

Terror Reigns Among Europeans As Mob Stages Riots In Egyptian City, Storms Under Attack of Populace.

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, July 16. (UP)—British and Egyptian troops, approximately 1,000 strong, stood guard in the streets of Alexandria today, maintaining the order that was restored only after 40 were killed and 40 injured during riots throughout the city yesterday.

Hotting Well-Organized Apparently preconcerted and well organized riot broke out in Alexandria today, a two hour period of silence in memory of some seven persons who were killed in comparatively small districts last Monday last, week.

Police were summoned from the British garrison and the Egyptian police and turned them out to maintain order.

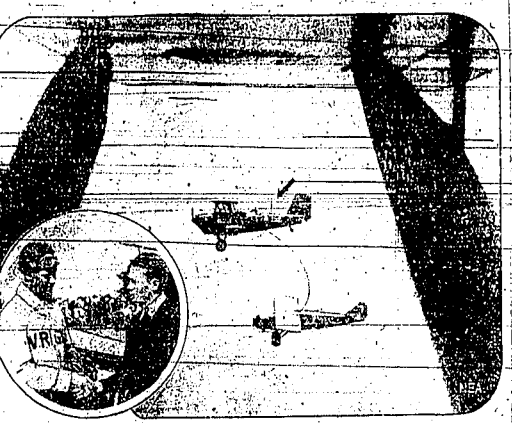

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THE VOICE OF THE FLAME
 WHEN sober scientists undertake to put on a show, they can usually stage something that makes ordinary vaudeville wonders look simple.
 A group of the General Electric Company's engineers the other day set up a radio device to make light waves audible, just for the edification of the convention of the American Society of Civil Engineers.

First one of the engineers held a lighted match in front of a photo-electric cell. A dull rumbling, like thunder, came from an attached loudspeaker. Then a neon lamp was passed before the cell. A steady hum proceeded from the loudspeaker. Following this an ordinary incandescent bulb was put in front of the "mouth piece" and a roar that almost shook the building was forthcoming.

There were other tricks of a similar order. A specially-made German lamp produced a noise like a hoot owl. A battery lamp gave out sounds like the thumping of a bass drum. And so on, through marvel after marvel.

Now all of this, on the surface, may not look like much; but it is just a reminder of the fact that scientists have uncovered a whole universe of profound mysteries, lying hidden all about us. Learning to the queer noises made by light waves is a trifling act, when you stop to think about it. The medieval alchemist hunting for the elixir of life was never on the trail of anything half so thrilling.

Tennyson, observing a common flower blooming in a chink in a stone wall, remarked that it could but fully understand that bit of vegetable growth, from beginning to end, he would know what God and man is. The modern scientist is in the same position. If one could fully understand this business of light waves that produce thunder, drum beats and siren wails, one would have a clearer picture of the universe than any mortal that ever lived.

All of which is just another way of saying that the earth is compacted of profound mysteries. The scientists are peering into these mysteries bravely, but each one when solved merely uncovers a new one beyond it. They discover just enough to demonstrate that we live in a world of wonders.

And that, perhaps, is their chief service to us. Who can be certain, in a world where the tiniest flame can speak with a voice like thunder?

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TEN-MURDERS A YEAR
 ENGLAND may be the mother country, but there appears that mother and daughter have very little in common.

London, for instance, has just reported a drop in its murder rate. During 1929, in all the London police district, there were only ten murders committed. Yet the British aren't satisfied—for four of the murderers have thus far escaped justice.

Ten murders in a whole year! New York, Chicago or Detroit would look on a record like that as being a near approach to the millennium. And any time the police of any American city can catch 60 per cent of their murderers they will be more than satisfied. The present ratio is a mere fraction of that.

AN EXCHANGE OF VISITORS
 AMERICAN motorists are expected to spend around \$100,000,000 in Canada this summer. The great dominion north of the border has unrivaled attractions as a vacation land, and we're not speaking of its liquor laws now, either. Citizens of the United States are discovering the fact in increasing numbers every year.

However, Canadians to a good deal of touring, too, and a lot of them cross the border to do it. In 1929, according to dominion government figures, Canadian tourists spent more than \$111,000,000 in the United States, and more than 619,000 Canadian automobiles went south over the boundary. The figures probably will be higher this year.

Here is reciprocity of the finest sort. That famous unfortified frontier is in no danger as long as the two nations exchange friendly visits on such a scale.

VICTORY FOR NON-RESISTANCE?
 SARDAR VALLABHAI PATEL, leader of the Indian Nationalist movement now that Gandhi is in jail, tells an interviewer that England's effort to choke the independence movement will surely be defeated by the Indian's campaign of non-resistance—a move, he says, to which "the west has yet found no answer."

"You can beat us, you can shut us—but as long as we do not hit back, you cannot defeat us," he says. "We have shown not only the world but ourselves our capacity for suffering. And after a while you will begin to feel ashamed of yourselves."
 There is food for a good deal of thought in that remark. It is just within the bounds of possibility that events may prove it correct. At any rate, it is a dignified expression of a very noble ideal.

HOME LIFE OF SOVIET WORKER IS PROTECTED

MOSCOW (UP)—An unexpected warning against too drastic interference in the personal and home lives of the workers has just been issued by the Central Committee of the Communist Party, whose views on such matters are tantamount to an order.

The action was taken because of the change of tempo that has occurred in the ranks of Communist leadership these days. It is clearly in line with the concept, more colloquially called "harassment," introduced in all departments of national life after the recent spell of "aerobatic" spirit on the road towards socialization.

Proposals for immediate communitarianism of family life, for removal of children from their parents, the abolition of individual activities were accepted by the press only a few short months ago with great enthusiasm. Scarcely a week passed but the Lenin or M. S. Sabotage or some other imaginative comrade advanced a new scheme for rearranging the personal lives of the Soviet masses.

But now the Central Committee, at the head of which is Joseph Stalin, warns that:

"The realization of such measures and the plan without taking into consideration the material resources of the country, the loss of the welfare of the population for it would mean great losses of money and a severe discrediting of the very notion of socialist reorganization of the way of life."

It accuses Lenin and Sabotage leaders in these heavy reproaches of everyday life, as examples of comrades who are guilty of "exaggeratedness," "impatience and the desire to overcome with me jump all obstacles on the road to socialist reorganization."

The Central Committee accuses them with failure to take into consideration the backwardness of the country, "irresponsibility and economically."

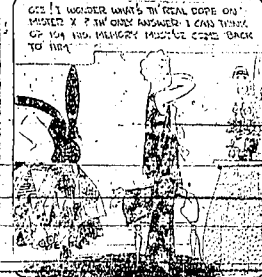

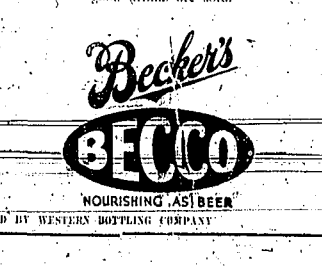

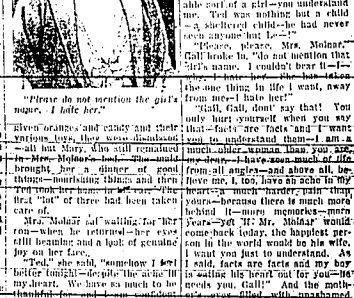
