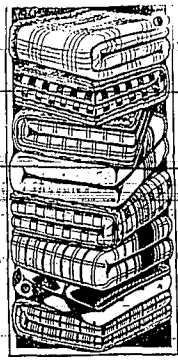

POLITICAL ABSURDITIES

DECLARING that the new tariff bill will increase imports, Congressman Willis P. Hawley, co-sponsor of the Hawley-Smoot tariff law, has joined the defenders of the new import duties by attacking its critics, who claim that the new schedules will cripple American trade.

But what are we to understand by a statement to the effect that the new bill will increase imports? Is this not in direct opposition to the theories of Republican leadership, which has always maintained that Democratic policies increased imports to the detriment of American industries?

If the new tariff measure is going to increase imports, what has become of our boasted protection to American industries?

Time and again in the past when a sincere effort was made to reduce the tariff on imported manufactured articles, to conform with the values of agricultural products, the Republican politicians and the Republican newspapers set up a hue and cry over the prospect of increased importations, to the detriment of American manufacturing industries. But now we find the same forces proclaiming to the country that the new bill on which they have spent nearly two years in an effort to please all producers, will be the means of increasing importations. If, then, importations are to be increased, what will happen to American industries?

Consistency was never a part of the party in power, which has blown both hot and cold as the occasion seemed to require.

If we are to take the word of those who sponsored the new tariff bill, then indeed we may well expect a further slump in business. If, on the contrary, we take a common sense view of the situation and conclude that the new high tariff schedules are bound to keep out importations, then we may expect renewed activity with corresponding high prices for industrial enterprises. Just where the farmer will come in on the general scheme remains to be seen. A large crop, necessitating exportation, will probably mean low prices. A short crop, with barely or not quite enough to supply the country, will mean good prices. A shortage in production of food stuffs abroad will quite naturally result in increased prices. So after all, the farmer's price depends largely, if not entirely, on supply and demand, regardless of tariffs high or tariffs low.

No class of people has been more persistently humbugged and flimflammed by tariff legislation than the farmers, when considered as a whole. Of late years they have derived some benefits as the result of a tariff on butter, but for years they got no help at all, while all the time they were victims of a tax on their purchases in the form of import duties on industrial products.

When Republican leadership, proclaims the need for a new bill that will increase imports, one is impressed and astounded by the lack of consistency and sincerity. Have the solons at Washington arrived at such a mental state that they cannot see the absurdity of their claims? How in the name of common sense can increased importations protect American industries? The Democrats, in framing tariff bills, never made claims for increased foreign trade. They maintained, and with a degree of consistency and logic now rarely found in the national capital, that a proper reduction of tariff schedules would result in keeping the prices of the American manufacturer within reason, without in any way interfering with the volume. A most business like and common sense conclusion.

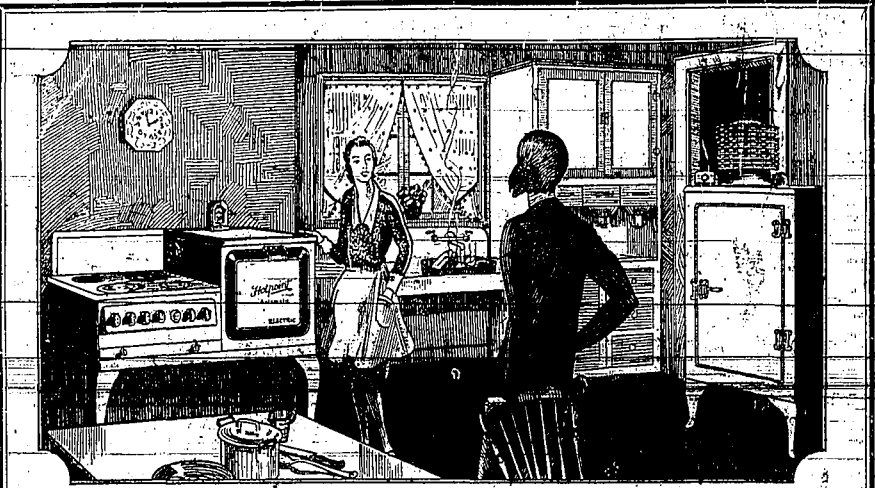

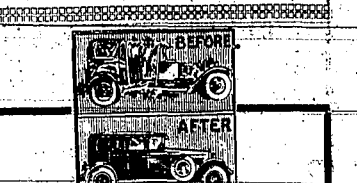
