SENATORS LEAVE FOR HOME AFTER CAUSTIC DEBATE

WASHINGTON, July 22 (UP)—Senators left today for their homes today with the London agreement ratified but with a stormy fight developed over whether the United States should accept \$100,000,000 in loans to its provisions.

Notification of the treaty by Congress effective when the Senate ratifies it, and the American ratification as deposited in the foreign archives in London.

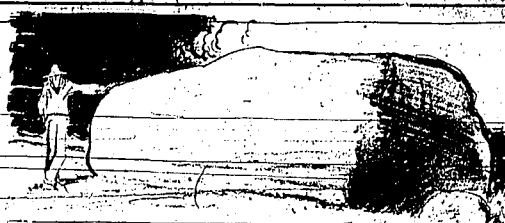
