DIRIGIBLE R-100 CRUISING TOWARD CANADIAN SHORE

Big British Ship Leaves Home Country on a Test Journey; Weather Conditions Are Not of the Best.

LONDON, July 29, (UP)—The dirigible R-100, Britain's challenge to Germany's achievements, sailed westward over a northerly route to Canada today on a test of skill and strength which may greatly influence the future of commerce of the air.

In comparison with the veteran Graf Zeppelin of Germany, the R-100 had yet to prove her quality in international commerce as the skill of British crews on long ocean flights has not yet been tried as has that of its Graf Zeppelin.

As the dirigible flew over the Irish coast, it was met by a heavy rain and squalls which were very annoying to the crew.

The flight of the R-100 for the first time was considered the first severe test of the ship, which with the R-101, will be used for commercial air service between different parts of the empire.

WASHINGTON, July 23. (UP)—Art Shires wishes to be known henceforth as an Outfielder. Shires, having been given a new job to do by the manager, Eddie Collins, announced to the press that he would accept the position of first baseman for the remainder of the season.

Announcement of the transfer of the league's first baseman was made after the conference of the Senators of Joe Kuhl, manager of the Chicago Cubs, who had been Shires' manager since he had been acquired for a price reported to be \$25,000, which would make him the most expensive recruit in the entire baseball history.

Shires asked for a chance to be sent back to the outfield, a position he had previously held, and he was not only granted the transfer, but also a new uniform, a new cap and new shoes. He will wear the number 15 on his uniform.

Shires, who is 27 years old, was born in the town of Salem, Ohio. He was a member of the University of Indiana team in 1917 and 1918. He played for the Chicago Cubs in 1927 and 1928.

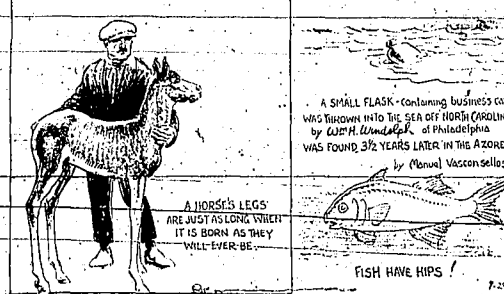

LIVING as we do nowadays on a diet consisting largely of concentrated and highly refined foods, many persons too often overlook the absolute need for a certain quantity of "digestible" food that keeps the digestive tract healthily at work and provides the excess bulk so necessary to profuse well being.

It is a recognized law of Nature that the digestive tract of any creature is adapted to suit the kind of diet to which the species long has been accustomed. And in order to obtain a clear picture of the importance of roughage in the human diet, it might be well for us to review briefly the three types of creatures—including man—that compose the animal kingdom.

First, there is the species known as herbivores, who are adapted entirely upon a diet of vegetable origin. These animals have a large capacity and intestine which are large enough to contain the large quantities of indigestible matter which must pass through the digestive tract.

Next to the group of animal species are the omnivores, who are adapted to a diet consisting of both animal and vegetable origin. In this group we find that the digestive tract is adapted to handle both types of food.

Finally, there is the group of carnivores, who are adapted to a diet consisting almost entirely of animal origin. These animals have a small intestine and a large stomach, which are adapted to handle a diet of animal origin.

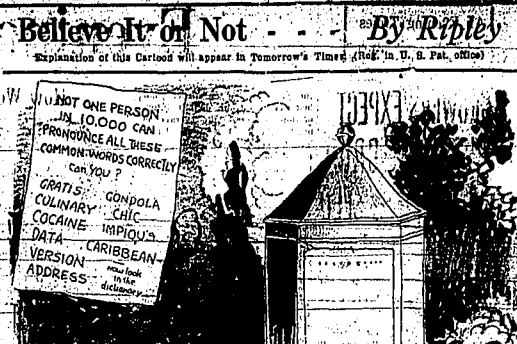

ALL HONOR TO GEORGE WASHINGTON

ENTHUSIASTIC over the news thus far received from the country regarding preparations that are being made to participate, both in the National Capital and the States, in the 1932 series of celebrations of the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of George Washington, heralded as "the greatest celebration thus far known in history," the associate directors and the members of the George Washington Bicentennial Commission no longer have any doubt that it will break all records.

Nearly one-half of the States and Territories have begun the work of preparation in one way or another, but it remains for the remainder still to "get busy." In the first little group of 14 to name local bicentennial commissions and start to work were the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia.

Of the local commissions that have been named, some have been created by acts of the State Legislatures, while some, in States where the Legislatures have not been in session, have been named by the governor as a citizens' or governor's committee, to be confirmed by act of legislature when they convene at their next sessions.

But meantime, these committees, however they have been named, have begun to function in cooperation with the United States commission, whose headquarters are in Washington.

It now seems certain that every State and Territory, and most foreign nations, will be represented in the series of programs in honor of the memory of George Washington, which will begin February 22, 1932, and will continue with one each month, and many auxiliary celebrations in between—until the grand final on Thanksgiving Day of the bicentennial year.

One of the plans of the directors of the bicentennial is to have every national or international organization in this country hold its national convention in 1932 in Washington and devote part of its program to commemoration of George Washington. The work of arranging for the time of such a large number of conventions so that they will not conflict is in itself enormous.

It is confidently believed that the entire nation will rally to the support of the backers of this most worthwhile movement.
