# NEGRO PROBLEM AGAIN BOTHERS SOUTH STATES

Evidence of increased racial feeling found in Dixie; Industrial depression, also blame for many lynchings

ATLANTA, Ga., Aug. 25 (AP)—The Negro problem once more is breaking into the headlines, industrial depression and consequent unemployment, and agitation of so-called "white supremacy" organizations are cited among immediate causes of the present perplexity.

While racial feeling is in the main part of the south, it is a direct development of the situation in Dixie, where in 1929, 20 lynchings were reported, 20 times the number of lynchings which was reported in the United States for nearly 250 years.

The tenacity of the situation has had expression in or since lynchings—often unprovoked—often through the medium of "white supremacy" organizations, and in the present perplexity.






