It was an open book, was heavily armed. He carried a 30-30 rifle. Picking up the slayer's trail, the posse followed him to the woods in pursuit. A forest ranger, who knew Vann, saw the slayer farther into the woods, armed and poised, a pack on his back. At the time he was unaware of the tragedy at Stillwater. From there, the trail rapidly faded and the posse—some of the sheriff's posse—lost the slayer.
