



# DESIGNER OF U. S. CAPITOL IS URGED FOR HALL OF FAME

WASHINGTON (UP)—Charles Buffum, the first American architect, and designer of the U. S. Capitol, has been nominated to the Hall of Fame by the board of directors of the American Institute of Architects, summation of the achievements of the early American designer have been sent to each elector of the Hall of Fame by the board.

"Few architects of our country have had a list of such notable buildings as those designed by Buffum," says the board in its plea. It was stated that Buffum's record as a statesman during the formative period of the nation should be sufficient to place the architect in the Hall of Fame as a "statesman," if not as an architect.

Buffum was born in Dowden Square, Boston, August 8, 1763. He studied architecture in London. A graduate of Harvard, Buffum became interested in designing work while attending to instruments on his father's and friends' houses. Later he was able to make an extensive tour of Europe studying the work of the architects of the old world.

While serving as a captain in the army, Buffum inaugurated street lighting, the system of education, establishment of a board of health, and financial committee that brought about order and system in the method of collecting city taxes.

In 1815, after completing his second term on the board of selectmen, Buffum was appointed architect of the United States Capitol in Washington.

Among the many buildings designed by the architect are: the County State House in Hartford in 1792, the first theaters in Boston, and five institutional buildings, including three hospitals, seven schools, and seven commercial and bank buildings.



# BORE BRUNT OF EARTH TREMORS

## "Apennines of Naples" Is Hardest Hit by Recent Quake in Italy.

Washington.—Italy's recent earthquake was confined to the most destructive effects to the mountainous region known as the Apennines of Naples," says a bulletin from the National Geographic society.

"Just north of Naples the mountain range extends down the middle of the Italian peninsula in the form of a double ridge and breaks down into rather distinct mountain groups, joined by craggy ridges and elevated spurs. This range of craggy peaks and 2000 feet above the sea level, the Apennines of Naples, where towns and villages perch on hilltops and cling to mountain slopes, has borne the brunt of the earth tremors, Earth to the east the Apennines of Italy has been shaken, too, but not so disastrously.

Crowded City in Beautiful Setting.—Naples, situated where steep slopes down to the Tyrrhenian sea, and close to where Vesuvius has been shaken severely as it has been many times before. The city is largely built of gray lava from Vesuvius and in its old part consists of narrow alleys and steeply ascending streets and alleys. 

DOCTORED EGGS PRODUCE ODD BABY CHICKENS

LONDON, (UPI)—Turkey eggs that produce odd Leghorn hens and those of other breeds that hatch as duck chickens may be possible as the process of transferring yolk from one egg to another develops.

Poultry experts who deal with nutrition believe that experiments which have been going on for some time will make this possible. Mrs. M. J. Hays, a French poultry expert, has made a survey of such experiments.

She says it is well known that artificial affects greatly the quality of the egg. This effect is due to the nature of the young that in adults. Little has been known in the past, according to the French nutrition expert, of the influence of diet on embryonic development.

Experiments conducted in France have shown that the influence of the chicken by modifying the contents of the egg have produced a hybrid embryo, a hybrid embryo during the incubation stages of the egg.

To perform such experiments, the shell is pierced and good materials are added, removed, or changed. After the egg is placed in the incubator, the shell is repaired with plaster of paris. The small amount of air and light which enters the egg seems to do little damage.

Mrs. Hays first recorded success with eggs which were laid in a hen's nest. The chickens produced had quite normal appearance and development, but were not healthy.

Mrs. Hays says the process has been tried in about 100 cases, and the operations include the exchange of yolk between eggs of the same breed and those of different breeds, and also between hen eggs, turkey eggs, and duck eggs. The results from these experiments have been interesting.

Changing the coloring and the influence of diet and some experiments have led poultry breeders to believe that diet may play a part as one of the factors determining sex.
