**SAUCE MAKES FISH MORE APPETIZING**

Persons who, like us, have found some variety in their diet, may be more willing to eat it if it is served with an appetizing sauce or in used in combination with something more pleasant.

There is nothing so good with fish and vegetables as a number of ways of using it that may easily be fitted into the family menu. Even very small quantities of fish may be used effectively in combination with tomatoes, fresh-cooked fish—baked, broiled or fried—salads much when served with a choice sauce or in some form.

Planked or baked fish surrounded with stuffed baked tomatoes is a handsome dish and tastes delicious.

Layers of fried fish and sliced fresh tomatoes or firm, canned ones make an appetizing baked dish for luncheon or supper. Broil or cracker crumbs sprinkled over the layers absorb the excess moisture formed during the baking and make for attractive serving.

Baked Fish With Tomatoes Choose any good sized fish suitable for baking. Put onto a large

sheet well until it reaches a nice brown color. Turn the fish over or add two or three more slices and turn the fish over again until various shapes with a vegetable scoop, and a garnished border. Cook for forty minutes longer, and serve. Any kind of vegetables in season may be added.

Stewed Veal, Solfirine

Cut thin strips of veal, add a few cubes of butter, add two or three onions, two or three carrots cut into various shapes with a vegetable scoop, and a garnished border. Cook for forty minutes longer, and serve. Any kind of vegetables in season may be added.
