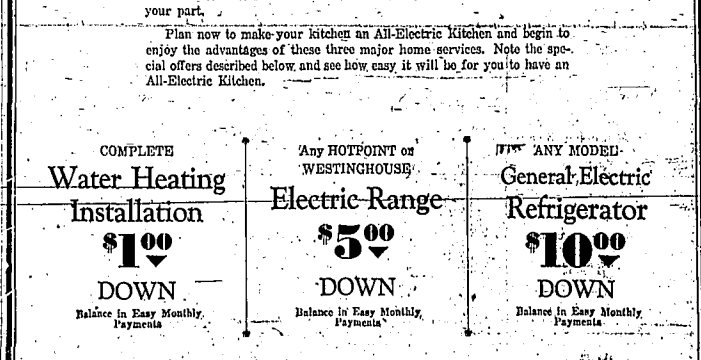

BONES OF SLAIN MEN INDICATE MINE LOCATION

Woman Prospector is Likely To Become Rich Because Of California Discovery; Find Traces of Old Shaft

NEWFALL, Calif., Sept. 19. (AP)—The bones of four murdered men, found on a slope of the Tehachan mountains, have been taken today to mark the end of a rail-haul trail followed 20 years by a woman prospector in quest of Lost Horse mine and its vast store of gold.

Anna L. Ross, the prospector, who led a posse of sheriff's deputies on a successful hunt for the bodies of four men, said she had found the bones of three men and a boy, who, according to legend, were slain near the mine in 1878 by "Hill" Charlie Kelly, with the gun man of the west.

It is believed that the bones were found in the district claim there in strong evidence to support it. Mrs. Ross may be able to unearth the celebrated shaft of the mine from which "Doc" Benjamin Franklin Bragg took \$500,000 in gold quartz half a century ago.

Bragg, an associate of "Lucky" Blaine of machine fame, revealed to Miss Ross the lost mine's location on the crude map, Bragg himself said "Hill" Kelly, for more gold, although he refused to name the cause of his reloading.

The woman kept climbing on the territory, but it was 20 years before she traced the shaft first worked by native Indians in 1822. Two days ago, digging in what appeared to be the site of an old Indian campsite, she uncovered two skeletons. Yesterday the skeletons she called in her deeper and found two more.

The skeletons also told of finding half a mile from the mine graves, traces of a shaft, although no shaft was visible.

Traditions of the neighborhood say Kelly drank heavily in the village store one night and boasted of slaying the four men. He found working the mine. He buried the victims near the mine, he said, but hidden again, none could find the spot.

Three days later he was ambushed by a pack-trail team of riggers and the next day neighbors came across his bullet-riddled body.

"Hill" Charlie Kelly never returned to return to take in "Doc" Bragg's work, but half a century was to pass before humans again set foot on the isolated slope.

And now Miss Ross believes she has found the Lost Horse mine.
