Supreme Court驳回了

Decision of Idaho Supreme Court, in an order received here Wednesday, affirmed a decision of Judge W. A. Jaehncke, district court, in the case of the state of Idaho against the Idaho Canal Company. Judge Jaehncke's decision held that the canal company cannot collect from the 250,000 approximately \$25,000 annually from 250 property owners for digging wells several years ago. The canal company has appealed the decision to the state supreme court.

WET PROSPECTS UNIMPRESSIVE AT THE POLLS

Anti-Prohibitionists Are Believed To Stand Little Chance of Adding to Power in the Coming Election

SACRAMENTO, Oct. 14 (UPI)—Despite the publication of recent minutes on the subject of prohibition, there is little prospect of the next congress containing more than an acre or two of wet, unless a considerable number change their stand after election.

A summary of the situation made by the United Press covering every congressional district and every senatorial contest in the country, indicates that the totals will give the election with 26 congressional districts and 17 senatorial seats already won.

Neat Little Twirls

To obtain a majority of known and avowed drys in the House they will need to win 12 more dry congressmen. For the wet to obtain a similar majority they

must win 172 seats in the contest districts.

Ninety-four avowed dry candidates for congress are without opposition in the November elections, while 12 others are being elected in the southern states. The dry forces can add to these 112 seats which are contested but with all of the candidates pledged to the cause of prohibition, the drys have already won 200 already when the count of ballots begin.

Wets have 12 candidates for the House who are uncontested with no opposition. Louisiana contains three of these and California four. Wisconsin has two and Pennsylvania, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, one each. In 31 other districts all candidates are wet.

Six of these are from Connecticut, five in Illinois, five in Wisconsin, the others are registered among New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Maryland, Ohio, Washington, Nebraska, Minnesota, Michigan and Mississippi. When added together the wets go into the election with 46 seats to the house of representatives already won.

Victory Already Won

In the Senate, where 34 seats are up for election, the wets have won two districts, where their victory already is won. In New Jersey Dwight W. Morrow, Heaton, and Almonde Smith, Heaton, Democrat both are in favor of repeal of the prohibition law. It is the only state where all senators are wet. The other states are Missouri, Puerto Rico, Louisiana, which is wet without opposition of any kind for the Senate.

The dry forces on the other hand have 11 unopposed candidates for the Senate. They are, incidentally, all Democrats, but

Georgia, Johnson, of Tennessee, Johnson, of Mississippi, and Byrd, of South Carolina, in 12 other states which will elect a total of 13 senators, all candidates are dry, except in West Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Tennessee, West Virginia, Alabama, South Dakota, Kansas (which elects two senators), Ohio, Iowa, Texas, Colorado and New Mexico.
