HOOVER OFFERS CENSUS FIGURES

Official Compilation Shows Changes in Personnel of the House of Representatives

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19 (UP)—President Hoover Tuesday officially announced the results of the 1936 national census as it affects representation of various states in the House of Representatives.

Outstanding gains were made by California, which will have nine more members in the House, by Michigan with four more and by Texas, with three.

Mr. Hoover said the official figures certified to him by the census bureau did not differ materially from the informal estimates made in recent months.

"The change in representation makes certain states to have 27 seats in the House, which are, of course, added to those of other states."

Uncle Sam's Planting Pointers

By H. VICTOR LUNDEN
Bureau of Plant Industry, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

As soon as the ground is free of snow, plan to plant. But be sure to plant in the right place. The ground is likely to suffer from winter and early spring weather. A mulch of straw or leaves will protect the plants and keep them from freezing. This is especially true of tender plants.

are subject to injury from winter winds. Early spring weather, and should precautions be taken.

Gardeners usually protect tops of plants with straw, evergreen boughs, or some fabric cover such as burlap. Here again protection is intended to prevent sudden changes in temperature rather than to keep out cold.

The warm sun in early spring will draw sap up into waxy plants prematurely and the night following may bring freezing temperatures. This condition gives rise to bark splitting and flower bud injury. If mulch is kept from the plants by covers, the temperature remains more uniform and damage is less likely.

Support All Covers
If a fabric is used to protect plants, erect a frame to support the material so that the cover does not touch the plants. This is essential for broadcast cover.

"To prevent damage from wind and ice storms, support with stakes or guy-ropes these plants that may be weighted down and broken."

HARVEST FOR NEIGHBOR
CLAYTON, Minn., (UP)—A farmer living near Watkins, in Stevens county, was faced with the possibility of losing a good yield because of the intense heat as he was too ill to harvest his crops. On Sunday the parish priest told the congregation of the man's plight. The stock man's field and by night the entire crop had been cut.

VETERAN DOCTOR DIES AT WENDELL

WENDELL, November 19 (Special)—Pneumonia claimed the life of Dr. Dan P. Albee, 74, retired physician, a former Twin Falls county commissioner, and resident of southern Idaho for nearly 50 years, at St. Valentine's hospital Tuesday. Dr. Albee had practiced medicine at Oakley, Shoshone and Bluff, but had devoted the latter part of his life to agricultural pursuits at Rock Creek, Homeworth and Wendell, and was a successful farmer.

The body now lies at the Litterman Undertaking parlors in Jerome. Dr. Albee's services were rendered to the people of southern Idaho as one of the first doctors of this region cannot be overestimated. He was a prominent figure in the development of southern Idaho.

He was born at Arcadia, Humboldt county, California, in January, 1862. He taught school in California until he was 27, then attended medical school in California and New York, completed his training and graduated from Columbia university. For 13 years he practiced in California, then came to Idaho in 1912 and established residence at Oakley, later moving to Shoshone.

He then went to Bluff, continuing to practice until 1912, when he became interested in agriculture. He operated a farm at Rock Creek for several years, and later moved to Shoshone. Three years ago he moved to the West Valley community southwest of Wendell.

He was twice county commissioner of Twin Falls county. He was active in grange work, and assisted in organizing a number of granges in this county.
