By defeating the hitherto unbeaten Northwestern eleven Saturday, 14-0, Notre Dame scored its eighth consecutive victory of the season and its 17th in succession since Northwestern's defeat of the Irish in the final game of the 1935 season, 27-14.

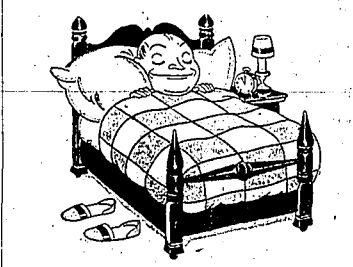
Foremost among the nation's select group of four major teams without a defeat or tie against them, Notre Dame has yet to face Army and Southern California in the last two games of perhaps the hardest schedule in all football history.

Army, which is undefeated and led by Nale, will meet Notre Dame before a crowd of 100,000 at Soldier Field here Saturday. The Irish will wind up their schedule with the Southern California team, which they defeated by Washington State 7-6, at Los Angeles, December 6.

The Irish had a miraculous escape from defeat at the hands of Northwestern, but the tide shift in the Irish in the last seven minutes of play and victory was achieved just as Rockne had cleverly planned after witnessing the Wildcats in action against Wisconsin the week previous.

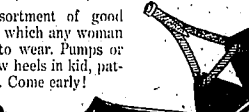

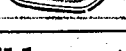

WAR DECLARED ON DISEASE IN IDAHO FORESTS

Expenditure of Approximately \$6,000,000 Planned to Eliminate White Pine Blister Rust in Timber

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, Nov. 24.—To insure protection of more than 13 billion board feet of standing white pine timber in Idaho, the private timber interests have joined in a war against white pine blister rust which involves expenditure of approximately \$6,000,000 within the next 10 years.

Alarmingly rapidly with which the blister rust is spreading in Idaho caused Governor H. C. Hall to call a conference which was held recently at the University of Idaho. Results of the conference have been announced by F. C. Miller, dean of the University of Idaho school of forestry, and chairman of a major committee.

Discussion pointed out that the white pine stands of Idaho, large and more valuable in the United States, are doomed to destruction unless prompt and adequate action is taken to control the damage.

It was pointed out that the destruction of a large part of the young growth but would not destroy the stands on merchantable timber as well, Dean Miller said.

Immediate execution of the plan of rust control program and continued activity during the winter of 1936 was deemed necessary, only means of forestalling the operations losses to the timber interests of the state.

Expenditures of the campaign in Idaho will be shared on a cooperative basis by the three land proprietors—the federal government, the state of Idaho, and the private owners.

Approximate figures for 1937 are \$250,000 for federal government, \$200,000 for the state, and \$150,000 for private owners.
