STALIN SPIKES ALL TALES OF RECENT REVOLU-

Source of Rumors Announcing Collapse of Soviet Regime Unknown But Leader Voices His Suspicions

MOSCOW, U. S. S. R., Nov. 24 (UPI)—Joseph V. Stalin, secretary general of the central committee of the Communist party received no official visitors yesterday, Saturday night and for an hour discussed Soviet affairs during his "assassination" by Alexei Gorky, editor of the newspaper in the west.

Asked if he had any objection to a detail of his "murder," the Soviet leader replied:

"Only one I have to deprive the Nazis of their last few mea-

ties. I am sorry for them."

Interview Frank

The interview was amazingly frank—the first he had ever granted a western correspondent. In the course of it, he denied reports of secret meetings between Soviet officials, and revealed the desire of Soviet "trots" at least to "strengthen the economic tie with

Stalin received me in his quiet office in a business building outside the Kremlin. His room was simply furnished, and on the walls were pictures of Lenin, Marx and Engels.

Stalin, a stockily built man of 52, of medium height, with a shock of hair streaked with gray, was obviously tired. His face showed the strain of enormous work. He did not look like a man who was quick to smile, and yet he had a touch of humor. His eyes frequently lit up, but his dark face lacked the sprightly expression of Trotsky.

The governor stated that he was internally and "rehabilitated" to assist in the interview.

At a distance, Stalin looks cold but at close range he manifests a broad smile as full of teeth as Roosevelt's and like Roosevelt's overshadowed by a shaggy mustache.

Deny Reports

Both Stalin and Voroshilov denied reports of revolt, mutinies and armed conflict. Valerian C. Bludov, high Soviet commander, as well as other recent alarms, stories.

It is necessary to deny the nonsense," Voroshilov remarked.

Stalin denied the reports and turned to Voroshilov, and: "What do you think?" he asked.

Stalin answered my question as to the probable origins of the sudden union, widely current abroad recently, by saying: "We are not guilty, but that he believed it 'an orchestrated campaign' by certain forces centered in Moscow and Berlin for the purpose of attracting attention from international heightened attention which we exposed."


for Philadelphia, where they will take on a comparatively weak team, Villa Nova, on Nov. 29.

The personification of a gentleman and a scholar, Colonel Longley was well-preserved, and with his 87 years behind him, possessed all the faculties of one, many years his junior.

He was an ornament to the profession of journalism and to the other vocations which he followed. He lived a purposeful life and his death was an honorable one. It will be well said that here was a successful career. No higher tribute can be recorded.

A WORD FOR INVESTORS

ONE often hears the comment, "This is a swell time to buy stocks," during the present business depression. Prices in many cases are only fractions of what they were 15 months ago. A rebound is not far around the corner. Obviously, someone is going to make a great deal of money when it comes.

Nevertheless, investors need to proceed cautiously. The current investment bulletin of the Alexander Hamilton Institute remarks pointedly:

"If the stock of a company which one sold over 100,000 shares at 20 it is because the position of the company has radically changed. If the earning power has declined in the meantime from the equivalent of \$10 per share to the equivalent of \$2 per share, the stock is no cheaper at \$20 than it was at \$100. It is true, furthermore, that when extensive changes in earning power have occurred, the full effect cannot be gauged immediately and that recovery rarely occurs with great rapidity. For these reasons it is desirable, as a rule, to avoid the apparent bargains presented by greatly deflated stocks."

A man who is preparing to invest in stocks would do well to ponder that.

POLITICS

IT IS HARD to find anyone who will say a good word for politics. In ordinary talk, the phrase "political trick" implies a somewhat unprincipled and conscienceless bit of chicanery, and the expression "just a politician" is far from complimentary. Nor is there any reason to doubt that this attitude toward politics is pretty largely justified by the facts.

Nevertheless, politics has improved immeasurably during the past generation; and if still it is not all that it ought to be, it is a thing of sweetness and light compared to some of its former manifestations.

Abundant proof of this is contained in George Ford Milton's recent book, "The Age of Hate," a biography of President Andrew Johnson. It makes the improvement obvious.

The book tells how President Johnson tried to introduce a little tolerance and humanity into the post-war reconstruction measures in the southland, and how the radical Republican clique that controlled Congress fought to the last ditch to prevent him.

Toward the middle of Johnson's term, these worthies decided to impeach him. A special committee from the House of Representatives held lengthy hearings, which quickly made it plain that he had committed no impeachable offense. Nevertheless, impeachment articles were voted, and the case went to the Senate for trial.

Then began one of the sorriest spectacles in American politics. The rulers of the Senate callously judged the case and announced gleefully that they would throw "the criminal in the White House" out of his job-in-short-order. Senator Charles Sumner of Massachusetts remarked that he did not need to listen to the evidence, as he was going to vote for a conviction anyhow.

The trial broke down all of the flimsy charges against Johnson, but the attack continued unabated. Folls were made, and it was found that one vote was lacking to make the two-thirds majority necessary to convict. So seven Republican senators who were believed ready to vote for acquittal were subjected to terrific pressure. Bribery was offered, threats were passed, plots were laid; the politicians stooped to unbelievable depths in a vain effort to force one of these seven senators to swallow his principles and vote for conviction.

It is an ugly story; and the one reaction that must come to every reader is the thought that it could not possibly be duplicated today. We have some small men in politics, and public sentiment countenances some shabby tricks; but nothing as bad as the Johnson impeachment case could happen today.


There may have been a "golden age" somewhere in the Republic's youth. A study of history, however, inclines one to the suspicion that the golden age lies ahead of us, not behind us.

WAR DECLARED ON DISEASE IN IDAHO FORESTS

Expenditure of Approximately \$6,000,000 Planned In Effort to Exterminate White Pine Blister Rust in Timber.

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, Nov. 24.—To assure protection of more than 13 billion board feet of standing white pine timber in the state, and to combat disease in excess of \$40,000,000, the federal government, the state of Idaho, and its private timber companies will co-operate in a concerted white pine blister rust which involves expenditure of approximately \$6,000,000 within the next 10 years.

Alarming rapidly with which the blisters rust is spreading in Idaho east of Government H. C. Smith, who called a conference which was held recently at the University of Idaho. comparable revenue and would not work for any individual or concern.

Tax Relief Needed

"Under this plan we would be retaining part of our revenue through other channels than taxation," he said. "The tax on timber, so far as my opinion is concerned, would be advisable to change the law to read that the physical property, which applies to lands, buildings, etc., can be taxed 20 per cent of its full cash value."

Present members of the association at recent meetings have declared that the rate is entirely too high and that it should be even greater than the rate of 20 per cent.

Further meetings—there will be one next Saturday—will be held and additional steps taken to perfect an organization.


