NEWARK, N. J., Dec. 17 (UPI)—A right-of-way granted to the United States constitution has been held invalid by United States District Judge William Clark, on the ground that it was improperly drawn.

The decision, which will go eventually to the United States Supreme court, is based on article V of the constitution—the amendment of which was ratified by the opinion of Judge Clark, that any transfer of power from the federal government must be effected by constitutional convention rather than the state legislatures.

STOCKS RECORD GREAT ADVANCE ON DAY'S MART

Many Issues Make Gains of
From One to Eight Points
And Sales Cross the Four
Million Mark in Brisk Rise

NEW YORK. Dec. 17 (UPI)—A turn in sentiment flashed over the market at mid-day today and turned a rather bear market into a bull movement.

Stocks which had been selling down to 5 points with dozens of issues having been turned around to end gains of 1 to more than 8 points.

Sales Enormous

Trading picked up in volume and the advances. Sales crossed the four million mark in a brisk rise.

TWO YEARS HENCE

WHEN the Evening Times last week treated of the direct primary and the possibilities of its passage at the legislative session this winter, there were cited some rumors which are being circulated designed to prevent Republican support of the measure. It was intimated that Byron Defenbach might be able to win the senatorial nomination over John Thomas if direct primary were in vote, listing this as one of the reasons why the old standby Republicans might not get very enthusiastic over direct legislation of any sort.

The Idaho Pioneer at Boise, agrees with the Evening Times that this is less than reason at all. In addition it contemplates the possibilities of Defenbach being more interested in the governorship two years hence. It says:

The Twin Falls Times urges that the mandate of the people in the November election was for a direct primary law. The Times refers to "propaganda" going the rounds to prevent the enactment of such a law and cites the fact that one argument that is being put forward is: "That Senator Thomas cannot be nominated on the Republican ticket two years hence over his prospective opponent, Byron Defenbach, if the primary is in vogue instead of the present convention system."

One would think that this is no argument at all, either for or against a direct primary. The only question before the house is whether a direct primary is the best thing for the state or whether it is not. Laws are not made to further or retard the personal fortunes of anybody.

And, anyway, Pioneer has a hunch, unauthoritative it is true, but a pretty good hunch at that, to the effect that Byron would rather be governor right now than senator. A couple of years from now may be the Republicans will be hunting around for somebody to beat Ross with, and we are wondering whether Byron might not be thinking some little things to the effect that he might be the spoiled pet of fortune in this respect.

"Sounds reasonable too." Ross was elected by Republicans sure because they couldn't have their own way in the convention with a Defenbach nomination. These voters are still Republicans and Defenbach might logically conceive himself to be the man to lead these recalcitrants back into the fold.

There are only two effective "machines" within the Republican party now. These are the Lukens and Defenbach organizations. Both are powerful. And it's quite too early to talk about it anyway.

Two years is a long way off, politically speaking, but facts are, much of what will happen then will be determined during the next two months. Reference is made to the accomplishments of the legislature.

Regardless of whose political fortunes the direct primary will hurt or benefit, it will likely be in effect for the next general election.

HOW THE BRITISH DO IT

THE British believe in being thorough, even in small matters. It is not surprising, therefore, to read that they have clamped down on the menace of the intoxicated automobile driver in a way to indicate that they mean business.

Their new traffic regulations do away with all of the old tests for drunkenness; indeed, it is not even necessary to prove that the driver is drunk. All the police have to do is prove that he was driving with enough liquor in him to make him "incapable of having the proper control of his car." Under a strict judge, a very slight deviation from normal would be enough to convict.

This is highly sensible. The man who undertakes to drive a motor car along a public highway has no business being even partly intoxicated. The British seem to have devised a sensible law to deal with the abuse.

WAGES GO DOWN IN ITALY

CONDITIONS in Italy must be a great deal less rosy than the friends of Fascism have been claiming. Mussolini's drastic program of wage reduction, under which millions of workers and farmers are getting their incomes reduced from 8 to 25 per cent, is hardly a sign of good economic health.


This program probably will involve a severe test of the power of the whole Fascist regime. It is hard to imagine anything that would make a government much more unpopular with the rank and file of the citizens. If Mussolini gets away with it it will have to be admitted that he is firmly enthroned.

It is interesting to note that his program is out of line with modern economic thought. Henry Ford, for instance, would say that this wage-reduction plan is the surest way on earth to keep prosperity from returning to Italy. And Ford is not exactly an amateur on the subject.
