The question most frequently asked of the Twin Falls county agent was the cause of the low alfalfa yield in March of this year. "Why won't my alfalfa yield as it formerly did," he was told, "when the tract was first brought under cultivation." EXPERTS CLASSIFY WILDFOWL DISEASE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 25 (UP)—

The mysterious malady popularly called "Duck Disease" which has killed millions of ducks and other wild waterfowl in the north is a disease of bacterial origin, the U. S. Biological Survey announced today. The disease, prevalent in the West River marsh, Utah.

The discovery was made after a two-year study by experts of the survey and the threat of a deadly disease to the waterfowl of the agriculture department. Originally it had been attributed to alkali poisoning.

"The duck sickness is a form of botulism, caused by the pathogenic bacteria, Clostridium botulinum, type C, the Biological Survey announced.

The death toll of the disease was reported heaviest in northern California, northern Utah and southern Oregon. Decision that the disease was not caused by alkali poisoning, as has been suggested, was reached when search proved that ducks in building other alkaline regions were not affected. It was found that while "disease" was present in some of the areas where countless thousands of waterfowl had perished, it was in such negligibly weak concentrations that its direct toxic effect on wild fowl seemed impracticable.

The announcement today, the Biological Survey said, was only preliminary and final statement concerning the disease would have to await completion of further laboratory experiments and field work.

This malady affects waterfowl much like paralysis, the birds exhibiting marked weakness of leg, wing and neck muscles. In the early stages there is unsteady gait, coupled with a tendency to fly, coupled with a tendency to move the head backward and forward and a failure of the eye membranes to contract. Finally the bird topples over and is unable to rise, breathing becomes labored and the bird dies.

DWARFISM DUE TO GLAND INACTIVITY

NEW YORK, Dec. 25 (UP)—

Some of the mysteries of dwarfism or "retardation" were clarified today in the annual report of Dr. William Darrach, dean of the medical medicine at Columbia University.

Failure of the hypophysis gland to function properly is the proper explanation for the presence of all dwarfs, according to Dr. P. E. Smith of Columbia and Dr. J. C. McDowell, of Carleton Institute for Experimental Evolution.

The hypophysis gland is one of the ductless tubes which are generally supposed to govern human behavior. It was explained and supplies the blood with the pituitary gland extract, necessary for growth.

"When this gland fails to function, the causes are hereditary, and to correct dwarfism sufficient quantities of pituitary gland extract must be injected, the doctor discovered, growth then resumes otherwise after the first 16 days.

Craft Equipped for Aerial
Photography Pressed Into
Service in Order to Study
Route of Fine New Highway

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Mon-

itor, Dec. 25.—Bureau mountain country, through which Lewis and Clark traveled on the Lolo trail in September, will be explored again, not from the old Indian trail but from a speculative airplane equipped for aerial photography.

How this new aid to surveying and mapping is being used to solve difficult engineering problems in the location of the Lewis and Clark highway between Idaho and Montana is described by Sherman H. Green, chief of way engineering for the Idaho department of public works, today in the December issue of the Idaho Engineering Journal, published by students of the University of Idaho college of engineering.

Aerial photography has been developed in the last eight or ten years, largely by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, and it is now valuable to engineers in all sorts of engineering work. It is especially useful for aerial photography in the case of the Lewis and Clark highway, which is a 50-mile unconstructed way across canyon country which will be surveyed. On 25 miles of this there is no survey and no recent reconnaissance.

Aerial maps already prepared have proved valuable for investigation of the highway route, says Mr. Green. Final route selection and preliminary estimates can be settled during the winter by the engineering parties concerned in the project through the use of aerial methods. Ground methods, using the usual table, transit and chain of the surveyors, would undoubtedly consume several seasons, he says.
